## A RESOLUTION

1 Expressing condolences on the death of Clair Eugene Paules and  
2 honoring his life and contributions to his community of Red  
3 Lion.

4 WHEREAS, Clair Eugene Paules, 87, an active member of the Red  
5 Lion community, died on June 20, 2014, in York, Pennsylvania;  
6 and

7 WHEREAS, A graduate of Red Lion Area High School and Lehigh  
8 Valley College, Mr. Paules served his country for three years in  
9 the United States Army Air Corps during World War II; and

10 WHEREAS, Mr. Paules, a retired project engineer, served as a  
11 firefighter, fire police captain and lifetime member of the Leo  
12 Independent Fire Company in Red Lion; and

13 WHEREAS, A past commander with the Coast Guard Auxiliary,  
14 Flotilla #1405, Mr. Paules also worked as a boating instructor  
15 and boat examiner for the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission;

17 WHEREAS, Mr. Paules made many contributions to his community  
18 through his leadership in a variety of organizations, including

1 the Boy Scouts, Junior Achievement, Jaycees, Tall Cedars,  
2 Masonic Lodge, Lions Club, American Legion, Veterans of Foreign  
3 Wars, County Honor Guard, Republican Club of York County, Red  
4 Lion Municipal Authority, Red Lion Area Historical Society and  
5 Adamsville United Methodist Church, among others; and

6 WHEREAS, In his spare time, Mr. Paules enjoyed boating,  
7 camping, hunting, fishing, slot-car and go-cart racing,  
8 vacationing in Indian River, Delaware, and spending time with  
9 his wife of 66 years and his children, grandchildren and great  
10 grandchildren; therefore be it
