AN ACT

Amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in child protective services, further 2 3 providing for definitions, AND, for persons required to <-report suspected child abuse and for reporting procedure AND <--FOR INVESTIGATING PERFORMANCE OF COUNTY AGENCY; and repealing <-provisions relating to definitions, school employees, 6 administration, investigation, responsibilities of county 7 8 agency for child protective services and report information; 9 AND FURTHER PROVIDING FOR SERVICES FOR PREVENTION, INVESTIGATION AND TREATMENT OF CHILD ABUSE. 10 11 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 12 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. The definitions of "founded report," "founded 13 report for school employee, " "general protective services," 14 15 "indicated report," "indicated report for school employee," 16 "individual residing in the same home as the child," "near 17 fatality" and "school employee" in section 6303(a) of Title 23 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended and the subsection is amended by adding definitions to read:

- 9 (a) General rule. -- The following words and phrases when used
- 10 in this chapter shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 11 section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

- 24 on a finding that a child who is a subject of the report has
- 25 been abused, including the entry of a plea of quilty or nolo-
- 26 contendere or a finding of guilt to a criminal charge involving
- 27 the same factual circumstances involved in the allegation of
- 28 child abuse.] A child abuse report involving a perpetrator that
- 29 <u>is made pursuant to this chapter, if any of the following</u>
- 30 applies:

Τ	(1) There has been a judicial adjudication based on a
2	finding that a child who is a subject of the report has been
3	abused and the adjudication involves the same factual
4	circumstances involved in the allegation of child abuse. The
5	judicial adjudication may include any of the following:
6	(i) The entry of a plea of guilty or nolo
7	contendere.
8	(ii) A finding of guilt to a criminal charge.
9	(iii) A finding of dependency under 42 Pa.C.S. §
10	6341 (relating to adjudication) if the court has entered
11	a finding that a child who is the subject of the report
12	has been abused.
13	(iv) A finding of delinquency under 42 Pa.C.S. §
14	6341 if the court has entered a finding that the child
15	who is the subject of the report has been abused by the
16	child who was found to be delinquent.
17	(2) There has been an acceptance into an accelerated
18	rehabilitative disposition program and the reason for the
19	acceptance involves the same factual circumstances involved
20	in the allegation of child abuse.
21	(3) There has been a consent decree entered in a
22	juvenile proceeding under 42 Pa.C.S. Ch. 63 (relating to
23	juvenile matters), the decree involves the same factual
24	circumstances involved in the allegation of child abuse, and
25	the terms and conditions thereof include an acknowledgment,
26	admission or finding that a child who is the subject of the
27	report has been abused by the child who is alleged to be
28	delinquent.
29	(4) A final protection from abuse order has been granted
30	under section 6108 (relating to relief), when the child who

Τ	<u>is a subject of the report is also one of the individuals</u>
2	protected under the protection from abuse order and:
3	(i) only one individual is charged with the abuse in
4	the protection from abuse action;
5	(ii) only that individual defends against the
6	charge; and
7	(iii) the protection from abuse adjudication finds
8	that the abuse occurred and restricts visitation to
9	include supervised custody or prohibits further contact
10	between the individual and the child.
11	["Founded report for school employee." A report under
12	Subchapter C.1 (relating to students in public and private
13	schools) if there has been any judicial adjudication based on a
14	finding that the victim has suffered serious bodily injury or
15	sexual abuse or exploitation, including the entry of a plea of
16	guilty or nolo contendere or a finding of guilt to a criminal
17	charge involving the same factual circumstances involved in the
18	allegations of the report.]

20	"FOUNDED REPORT." A CHILD ABUSE REPORT INVOLVING A
21	PERPETRATOR THAT IS MADE PURSUANT TO THIS CHAPTER, IF ANY OF THE
22	FOLLOWING APPLIES:
23	(1) THERE HAS BEEN A JUDICIAL ADJUDICATION BASED ON A
24	FINDING THAT A CHILD WHO IS A SUBJECT OF THE REPORT HAS BEEN
25	ABUSED AND THE ADJUDICATION INVOLVES THE SAME FACTUAL
26	CIRCUMSTANCES INVOLVED IN THE ALLEGATION OF CHILD ABUSE. THE
27	JUDICIAL ADJUDICATION MAY INCLUDE ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:
28	(I) THE ENTRY OF A PLEA OF GUILTY OR NOLO
29	CONTENDERE.
30	(II) A FINDING OF GUILT TO A CRIMINAL CHARGE.

- 1 (III) A FINDING OF DEPENDENCY UNDER 42 PA.C.S. § 2 6341 (RELATING TO ADJUDICATION) IF THE COURT HAS ENTERED 3 A FINDING THAT A CHILD WHO IS THE SUBJECT OF THE REPORT 4 HAS BEEN ABUSED. (IV) A FINDING OF DELINQUENCY UNDER 42 PA.C.S. § 5 6341 IF THE COURT HAS ENTERED A FINDING THAT THE CHILD 6 7 WHO IS THE SUBJECT OF THE REPORT HAS BEEN ABUSED BY THE 8 CHILD WHO WAS FOUND TO BE DELINOUENT. 9 THERE HAS BEEN AN ACCEPTANCE INTO AN ACCELERATED 10 REHABILITATIVE DISPOSITION PROGRAM AND THE REASON FOR THE ACCEPTANCE INVOLVES THE SAME FACTUAL CIRCUMSTANCES INVOLVED 11 IN THE ALLEGATION OF CHILD ABUSE. 12 13 (3) THERE HAS BEEN A CONSENT DECREE ENTERED IN A 14 JUVENILE PROCEEDING UNDER 42 PA.C.S. CH. 63 (RELATING TO JUVENILE MATTERS), THE DECREE INVOLVES THE SAME FACTUAL 15 16 CIRCUMSTANCES INVOLVED IN THE ALLEGATION OF CHILD ABUSE AND THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE [ALLEGATION] CONSENT DECREE 17 18 INCLUDE AN ACKNOWLEDGMENT, ADMISSION OR FINDING THAT A CHILD 19 WHO IS THE SUBJECT OF THE REPORT HAS BEEN ABUSED BY THE CHILD 20 WHO IS ALLEGED TO BE DELINQUENT. (4) A FINAL PROTECTION FROM ABUSE ORDER HAS BEEN GRANTED 21 UNDER SECTION 6108 (RELATING TO RELIEF), WHEN THE CHILD WHO 22 23 IS A SUBJECT OF THE REPORT IS ONE OF THE INDIVIDUALS 24 PROTECTED UNDER THE PROTECTION FROM ABUSE ORDER AND:
- (I) ONLY ONE INDIVIDUAL IS CHARGED WITH THE ABUSE IN 25 THE PROTECTION FROM ABUSE ACTION; 26
- (II) ONLY THAT INDIVIDUAL DEFENDS AGAINST THE 27 28 CHARGE;
- 29 (III) THE ADJUDICATION INVOLVES THE SAME FACTUAL CIRCUMSTANCES INVOLVED IN THE ALLEGATION OF CHILD ABUSE; 30

12	evidence of the alleged abuse exists based on any of the

18	(1) Subject to paragraphs (2) and (3), a report of child
19	abuse made pursuant to this chapter if an investigation by
20	the department or county agency determines that substantial
21	evidence of the alleged abuse by a perpetrator exists based

24	(ii) The child protective service investigation.
25	(iii) An admission of the acts of abuse by the
26	perpetrator.
27	(2) A report may be indicated under paragraph (1) (i) or
28	(ii) for any child in need of child protective services,
29	regardless of the number of alleged perpetrators or the
30	inability to identify the specific perpetrator among two or

10	Subchapter C.1 (relating to students in public and private	
11	schools) if an investigation by the county agency determines	
12	that substantial evidence of serious bodily injury or sexual	
13	abuse or exploitation exists based on any of the following:	
14	(1) Available medical evidence.	
15	(2) The county agency's investigation.	
16	(3) An admission of the acts of abuse by the school	
17	employee.	
18	"Individual residing in the same home as the child." An	
19	individual who is 14 years of age or older and who resides in	
20	the same home as the child.]	
21	"Independent contractor." An individual who provides a	<
22	program, activity or service to an agency, institution,	
23	organization or other entity, including a school or regularly	
24	established religious organization, that is responsible for the	
25	care, supervision, guidance or control of children. The term	
26	does not include an individual who has no direct contact with	
27	<u>children.</u>	
28	"Mandated reporter." A person who is required by this	
29	chapter to make a report of suspected child abuse.

- 2 places a child in serious or critical condition.] A child's
- 3 <u>serious or critical condition, as certified by a physician,</u>
- 4 where that child is a subject of the report of child abuse.

- 30 the basis of medical, professional or other training and

Reports from persons required to report 14 under section 6311 (relating to persons required to report-15 suspected child abuse) shall be made immediately by telephone and in writing within 48 hours after the oral report. 16 17 (b) Oral reports. Oral reports shall be made to the 18 department pursuant to Subchapter C (relating to powers and 19 duties of department) and may be made to the appropriate county-20 agency. When oral reports of suspected child abuse are initially received at the county agency, the protective services staff 21 shall, after seeing to the immediate safety of the child and 22 23 other children in the home, immediately notify the department of 24 the receipt of the report, which is to be held in the pending 25 complaint file as provided in Subchapter C. The initial child-26 abuse report summary shall be supplemented with a written reportwhen a determination is made as to whether a report of suspected 27 28 child abuse is a founded report, an unfounded report or an-29 indicated report. 30 (c) Written reports.
