AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," providing for Holocaust, genocide and
- 6 human rights violations instruction.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 10 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
- 11 section to read:
- 12 <u>Section 1554. Holocaust, Genocide and Human Rights</u>
- 13 <u>Violations Instruction.--(a)</u> Beginning with school year 2014-
- 14 2015 and each school year thereafter, each public school student
- 15 <u>shall receive mandatory instruction in the Holocaust, genocide</u>
- 16 and human rights violations from grade six (6) through grade
- 17 <u>twelve (12). The instruction shall be integrated within the</u>
- 18 social studies and language arts courses of study required in
- 19 <u>accordance with the State Board of Education regulations.</u>
- 20 Instruction may also be integrated into other appropriate

- 1 courses of study. The following shall apply:
- 2 <u>(1) This instruction:</u>
- 3 (i) Shall be age appropriate.
- 4 (ii) Shall be sequential in method of study.
- 5 (iii) Shall communicate the connection between national,
- 6 <u>ethnic</u>, racial or religious intolerance and the subjects
- 7 established under subsection (b).
- 8 (iv) Shall communicate the impact of personal
- 9 responsibility, civic engagement and societal response within
- 10 the context of the subjects established under subsection (b).
- 11 (2) School districts may utilize any appropriate public or
- 12 private materials, personnel and other resources in developing
- 13 and implementing this program of instruction. The Department of
- 14 Education shall make available information about appropriate
- 15 curriculum materials upon request of a school district.
- 16 (b) The Department of Education shall establish curriculum
- 17 quidelines no later than twelve (12) months after the effective
- 18 date of this section. The following shall apply:
- 19 (1) The guidelines shall encourage the inclusion of the
- 20 following subjects where appropriate in the instruction:
- 21 (i) The breadth of the history of the Holocaust, including
- 22 the Third Reich dictatorship, concentration camp system,
- 23 persecution of Jews and non-Jews, Jewish and non-Jewish
- 24 resistance and post-World War II trials.
- 25 (ii) The definition, history, response and actions taken in
- 26 the face of genocides, including the Holocaust, the Armenian
- 27 Genocide, the Bosnian Genocide and the Genocide in Sudan.
- 28 (iii) Human rights violations.
- 29 (iv) Anti-Semitism, racism and the abridgment of civil
- 30 rights.

- 1 (2) School districts may utilize any curriculum that
- 2 <u>complies with the requirements of this subsection.</u>
- 3 (3) The Department of Education and school districts may
- 4 work in consultation with organizations that provide educational
- 5 resources related to the Holocaust, genocide and human rights
- 6 <u>violations to develop these curriculum guidelines.</u>
- 7 (c) Beginning with the 2014-2015 school year and each school
- 8 year thereafter, the Secretary of Education shall make
- 9 available, to all school districts and intermediate units, in-
- 10 service training programs based upon the instruction
- 11 requirements established under subsection (a) and the curriculum
- 12 guidelines established under subsection (b).
- 13 <u>(d) The following shall apply:</u>
- 14 (1) Beginning with the 2014-2015 school year and each school
- 15 year thereafter, each school district shall provide, as part of
- 16 its in-service training, programs on the Holocaust, genocide and
- 17 human rights violations for all instructors whose teaching
- 18 responsibilities include courses of study in which mandated
- 19 instruction concerning the Holocaust, genocide and human rights
- 20 violations is integrated. A school district may utilize the
- 21 programs made available by the Department of Education or use
- 22 other alternative programs.
- 23 (2) Employes required to undergo continuing professional
- 24 education under section 1205.2 shall receive credit toward the
- 25 <u>continuing professional education requirements if the training</u>
- 26 program has been approved by the Department of Education.
- 27 (e) The Department of Education shall provide the
- 28 quidelines, in-service training and any other materials
- 29 <u>developed in accordance with this section to any nonpublic</u>
- 30 school within this Commonwealth upon receiving a request from

- 1 the nonpublic school.
- 2 (f) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules and
- 3 regulations necessary for the implementation of this section.
- 4 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
