AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in preliminary provisions, providing
- for mandate waiver program for transportation.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 10 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
- 11 section to read:
- 12 <u>Section 122. Mandate Waiver Program. -- (a) The department</u>
- 13 may, upon application by a governing body of a school entity,
- 14 waive any provision of this act related to transportation, the
- 15 regulations of the State Board of Education related to
- 16 transportation or the standards of the secretary related to
- 17 transportation if the waiver will enable the school entity to
- 18 operate in a more effective, efficient or economical manner.
- 19 (b) In order to be eligible for a waiver under subsection
- 20 (a), the school entity must submit an application adopted by the

- 1 governing body of the school entity at a regularly scheduled
- 2 meeting of the governing body.
- 3 (c) The application shall be submitted in a form and manner
- 4 prescribed by the department and shall:
- 5 (1) Specify the need for the transportation waiver.
- 6 (2) Provide supporting data and information to show the
- 7 benefits to be obtained by the waiver.
- 8 (d) The department shall have sixty (60) days from the
- 9 receipt of the application to approve, disapprove or request
- 10 modifications to the application. If the department fails to act
- 11 within sixty (60) days, the waiver shall be deemed approved.
- (e) Upon disapproval of an application, the department shall
- 13 provide a written determination setting forth the reason for the
- 14 disapproval. The governing body may submit a revised application
- 15 for a waiver.
- 16 (f) Three (3) years following the implementation of the
- 17 waiver, the governing body shall submit an evaluation of the
- 18 effectiveness of the program or operational change. If the
- 19 <u>evaluation indicates improvement in school operations</u>, the
- 20 waiver shall be renewed by the department and shall remain in
- 21 effect unless rescinded by the governing body.
- 22 (q) The governing body may not waive any Federal or State
- 23 law applicable to a school entity that is not included in this
- 24 act or 22 Pa. Code (relating to education).
- 25 (h) Nothing in this section shall be construed to:
- 26 (1) Supersede or preempt any provisions of a collective
- 27 <u>bargaining agreement in effect on the effective date of this</u>
- 28 section.
- 29 (2) Permit the department to relieve any school district
- 30 from the obligation to transport nonpublic school students as

- 1 required under section 1361.
- 2 (i) For the purposes of this section, the following words
- 3 <u>and phrases shall have the following meanings:</u>
- 4 <u>"Department." The Department of Education of the</u>
- 5 Commonwealth.
- 6 <u>"Governing body." The board of school directors of a school</u>
- 7 <u>district or the governing board of an area vocational-technical</u>
- 8 school, an intermediate unit, a charter school or a cyber
- 9 charter school.
- 10 "School entity." A school district, an area vocational-
- 11 <u>technical school</u>, an intermediate unit, a charter school or a
- 12 <u>cyber charter school</u>.
- "Secretary." The Secretary of Education of the Commonwealth.
- 14 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
