6	Section 1. Section 4702(g) of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania
7	Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding paragraphs and the

11	(g) ExceptionsThe following are exceptions to subsection

14	(5) Emission inspection criteria for newest model year
15	vehiclesA subject vehicle shall be exempt from the
16	requirements for emission inspection for ten years from the
17	date of original registration.
18	(6) Emission inspection criteria for alternative fuel

1	vehiclesA subject vehicle powered by electric, hybrid
2	electric or compressed natural gas shall be exempt from the
3	requirements for emission inspection. A certificate of
4	exemption shall be affixed to the subject vehicle in a manner
5	prescribed by department regulations.
6	(h) Notification to Environmental Protection AgencyThe
7	department, in consultation with the Department of Environmental
8	Protection, shall immediately notify the Environmental
9	Protection Agency of the modifications to the vehicle emission
10	program in subsection (g)(5) and (6) and of the intent to seek
11	its approval of the plan in accordance with the requirements of
12	Federal law.
13	(i) Anti-tampering inspectionsNotwithstanding the
14	provisions of subsection (g)(5) and (6), newest ten model year
15	and alternative fuel vehicles shall be subject to visual anti-
16	tampering inspections for the presence of emissions control
17	components installed on the vehicle by manufacturers.
18	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
