AN ACT

Amending the act of March 24, 1905 (P.L.50, No.35), entitled, "An act to reorganize the Board of Trustees of The Pennsylvania State College," further providing for title of the act and for members of the Board of Trustees of The Pennsylvania State University; and providing for quorum and lifetime service limitation.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows:
Section 1. The title of the act of March 24, 1905 (P.L.50, No.35), entitled, "An act to reorganize the Board of Trustees of The Pennsylvania State College," is amended to read:

> AN ACT

To reorganize the Board of Trustees of The Pennsylvania State [College] University.
Section 2. Section 1 of the act, amended June 24, 1939 (P.L.863, No.367), is amended to read:

Section 1. Be it enacted, \&c., That[, in addition to the present elective members of the Board of Trustees of The Pennsylvania State College, the said Board shall consist of the following members, to wit: Three members to be elected each
year, for a term of three years each, by the alumni of said college; two members to be appointed each year, for a term of three years each, by the Governor of the Commonwealth, and confirmed by the Senate; and the following members to serve exofficio during their respective terms of office: The Governor of the Commonwealth, the President of the College, the State Superintendent of Public Instruction, the Secretary of Agriculture, and the Secretary of Mines.]:
(1) The Board of Trustees of The Pennsylvania state University, formerly The Pennsylvania State College, shall be reorganized in the manner that is deemed appropriate by the current elective members and shall from this day forward consist of the following members:
(i) Six members that are representative of the interest of the alumni to be elected, for a term of three years each, by the alumni of the university.
(ii) Four members that are representative of the interest of the agricultural community to be elected, for a term of three years each, by the county agricultural societies.
(iii) Four members that are representative of the interest of the business and industry community to be elected, for a term of three vears each. At least two of the businesses and industry's representatives shall represent fields that are major academic focuses of the university. The Board of Trustees shall develop a process for the selection of the business and industry representative members that is fair and transparent, that involves the business and industry community and that is not a selection process by a vote of the Board of Trustees itself.
(iv) Four members that are appointed by the Governor of the Commonwealth and confirmed by the senate. At least one of these
members must be a student enrolled in a program offered by the university whose term shall expire at the time the student ceases to be enrolled at the university. All other members appointed under this subparagraph shall have a term of three years.
(v) The following members shall serve during their respective terms of office: the Governor, as a nonvoting member ex-officio; and the following three members of the Board of Trustees shall serve as voting members ex-officio: the Secretary of Agriculture, the Secretary of Conservation and Natural Resources, and the Secretary of Education.
(2) The President of the University may not be a member of the Board of Trustees.
(3) The elections and appointment of the members of the Board of Trustees under paragraph (1) (i), (ii), (iii) and (iv) shall be cycled in a manner that assures staggered expirations of terms.
(4) The Board of Trustees may appoint emeriti members provided that any member on the Board of Trustees by virtue of emeritus status shall be wholly honorary without voting rights. Participation rights that are vested solely in the statutorily established members shall not be extended to emeriti members.

Section 3. The act is amended by adding sections to read:
Section 2.1. A majority of the voting members of the Board of Trustees shall be a quorum required for taking any official action by the Board.

Section 2.2. No member of the Board of Trustees may serve more than a total of nine vears on the Board of Trustees during the course of that member's lifetime. This section shall apply to all members of the Board of Trustees, regardless of their
respective election and appointment dates, who serve on the effective date of this section, provided that any such member whose current term would violate this section may continue to serve for the duration of such current term only.

Section 4. Section 3 of the act is amended to read:
Section 3. (a) The officers of the Board of Trustees shall be [chosen] elected annually, to serve for a period of one year each[;] and shall be a [President] chair, a [Vice-President] Vice-Chair, a Secretary, and a Treasurer.[, and an Executive Committee of not less than three nor more than seven members, whose duty it shall be, under the direction and subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees, to transact such necessary business as may arise in the intervals between regular meetings of the Board. No member of the Board shall receive compensation for his services; but shall be paid necessary traveling and hotel expenses actually incurred in the performance of duty as such member. The Treasurer shall not be a member of the board, and shall give such bonds for the faithful performance of his duties, and receive such compensation as the Board may, from time to time, direct.]
(b) The Treasurer shall not be a member of the Board of Trustees, and shall give such bonds for the faithful performance of his duties, and receive such compensation as the Board of Trustees may, from time to time, direct.
(c) An Executive Committee of not less than three nor more than seven members, whose duty it shall be, under the direction and subject to the approval of the Board of Trustee, to transact such necessary business as may arise in the intervals between regular meetings of the Board of Trustees.
(d) The President of the University shall not serve as an

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officer of the Board of Trustees and shall not serve on the
Executive Committee, any standing committee, special committee
or subcommittee of the Board of Trustees.
    (e) No member of the Board of Trustees shall receive
compensation for his services; but shall be paid necessary
traveling and hotel expenses actually incurred in the
performance of duty as such member.
    Section 5. The act of February 22, 1855 (P.L.46, No.50),
