AN ACT

1 2	Providing for portability of professional and occupational licenses for military spouses.
3	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
4	hereby enacts as follows:
5	Section 1. Short title.
6	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Military
7	Spouse License Portability Act.
8	Section 2. Definitions.
9	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
10	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
11	context clearly indicates otherwise:
12	"Licensing board." A professional or occupational licensing
13	board or commission of this Commonwealth, including, but not
14	limited to:

5 "Military spouse." A person who is married to a member of 6 the armed forces of the United States or a reserve component of 7 the armed forces of the United States under the laws of the 8 jurisdiction where the marriage took place.

9 Section 3. Requirements for license.

(a) General rule.--Notwithstanding any other law, a licensing board shall issue a license to a military spouse to allow the military spouse to practice the military spouse's profession or occupation in this Commonwealth if, upon application to the licensing board, the military spouse satisfies all of the following conditions:

16 (1) Holds a current license, certificate, registration 17 or permit from another state, and that state's requirements 18 are substantially equivalent to or exceed the requirements 19 for a license in this Commonwealth.

20 (2) Demonstrates competency in the profession or
21 occupation through methods determined by the licensing board,
22 including having completed continuing education units or
23 having experience in the profession or occupation for at
24 least two of the five years preceding the date of the
25 application under this act.

(3) Has not committed any act in any state that would
have constituted grounds for refusal, suspension or
revocation of a license to practice that profession or
occupation in this Commonwealth at the time the act was
committed.

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(4) Is in good standing and has not been disciplined by
 the jurisdiction that issued the license.

3 (5) Pays any fees required by the licensing board from4 which the applicant is seeking a license.

5 (b) Rights and obligations.--A military spouse who is not a 6 resident of this Commonwealth and who is issued a license under 7 this act shall have the same rights and obligations as a 8 resident of this Commonwealth who is issued the same type of 9 license.

10 Section 4. Provisional license.

(a) General rule.--Notwithstanding any other law, a licensing board may issue a provisional license to a military spouse who is licensed, certified, registered or issued a permit in another state while the military spouse is satisfying certain requirements, as determined by the licensing board, for a license in this Commonwealth under section 3.

(b) Limited period.--A military spouse may practice under a provisional license issued under subsection (a) until any of the following occurs:

20 (1) A license is granted or denied by the licensing21 board under section 3.

(2) The provisional license expires.

(3) The holder of a provisional license fails to complywith its terms.

25 Section 5. Alternative procedure for licensure.

This act shall not prohibit a military spouse from proceeding under other licensure requirements established by a licensing board.

29 Section 6. Rules and regulations.

30 A licensing board may adopt rules or regulations necessary to

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- 1 implement this act.
- 2 Section 7. Effective date.
- 3 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
