_0	This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the Disaster

_3	It is the purpose of this chapter to create a State program	<

5	AND MUNICIPAL AUTHORITIES directly affected by natural and man-	<

_7	grants for projects that do not qualify for Federal assistance	
8 .	to help repair damages to primary residences, personal property	<
9	and public facilities. Grants will be made available by the

21	Presidential disaster declaration is not covering the area.	
22	§ 7903. Definitions.	
23	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter	
24	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the	_
25	<pre>context clearly indicates otherwise:</pre>	
26	"Account." The Disaster Emergency Assistance Account	<
27	<u>established under this chapter.</u>	
28	"Adjusted loss." The difference between:	
29	(1) eligible loss; and	
30	(2) covered loss.	

- 1 "Agency." The Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency.
- 2 "Covered loss." An amount received by or due the recipient
- 3 from private insurance and Federal grants and loans, including
- 4 applicable State matching funds, related to an eligible loss.
- 5 The term does not include an insurance deductible paid by the
- 6 <u>recipient.</u>
- 7 <u>"Disaster emergency area." An area included under a</u>
- 8 <u>declaration of disaster emergency issued by the Governor under</u>
- 9 <u>section 7301 (relating to general authority of Governor).</u>
- 10 <u>"Eliqible loss."</u> Damage to real property utilized as a <--
- 11 primary residence of the owner, personal property or a public
- 12 <u>facility caused by a natural or man-made disaster in a disaster</u>
- 13 <u>emergency area.</u>
- 14 <u>"Household." A social unit of individuals living together</u> <--
- 15 and comprised of any of the following:
- 16 <u>(1) Couples or legally married individuals and their</u>
- 17 dependents.
- 18 (2) An individual and his dependents.
- 19 <u>(3) Individuals who jointly own a residence and their</u>
- 20 dependents.
- 21 (4) Two or more individuals living at the same address,
- 22 whether related or not.
- 23 "Liquor tax." The tax imposed under the act of June 9, 1936
- 24 (1st Sp.Sess., P.L.13, No.4), entitled as "An act imposing an
- 25 emergency State tax on liquor, as herein defined, sold by the
- 26 Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing for the collection
- 27 and payment of such tax; and imposing duties upon the Department
- 28 of Revenue and the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board."
- 29 <u>"Man-made disaster."</u> Any industrial, nuclear or
- 30 transportation accident, explosion, conflagration, power

- 1 failure, natural resource shortage or other condition, except
- 2 <u>enemy action, resulting from man-made causes, including oil</u>
- 3 spills and other environmental contamination, which threatens or
- 4 <u>causes substantial damage to property, individuals, loss of life</u>
- 5 <u>or other hardships.</u>
- 6 "Natural disaster." Any hurricane, tornado, storm, flood,
- 7 <u>high water, wind-driven water, tidal wave, earthquake,</u>
- 8 <u>landslide</u>, <u>mudslide</u>, <u>snowstorm</u>, <u>drought</u>, <u>fire</u>, <u>explosion or</u>
- 9 <u>other catastrophe not resulting from a man-made cause which</u>
- 10 threatens or causes substantial damage to property or
- 11 <u>individuals</u>, possible loss of life or other hardships.
- 12 <u>"Personal property." Clothing, furniture, necessary</u> <--
- 13 <u>household items and appliances and essential tools for</u>
- 14 <u>employment or education.</u>
- 15 "PROGRAM." THE PUBLIC DISASTER ASSISTANCE GRANT PROGRAM <--
- 16 ESTABLISHED UNDER SUBCHAPTER B (RELATING TO PUBLIC DISASTER
- 17 ASSISTANCE GRANT PROGRAM).
- 18 "Public facility." Any facility which is owned, operated or
- 19 maintained by a political subdivision or municipal authority of
- 20 this Commonwealth. The term shall include:
- 21 (1) buildings and equipment;
- 22 (2) bridges, roads, highways and public ways;
- 23 (3) parks and recreational facilities;
- 24 (4) power generation and distribution facilities,
- 25 including natural gas systems, wind turbines, generators,
- 26 substations and power lines;
- 27 <u>(5) sanitary sewer systems and wastewater treatment</u>
- 28 facilities;
- 29 (6) drainage and flood control facilities;
- 30 (7) water treatment, water storage and water

15	The Individual Disaster Assistance Grant Program is	
16	established within the agency to provide grants to individuals	
17	for assistance with repair of disaster-related damage.	
18	§ 7912. Eligibility.	
19	To be eligible for a grant under this subchapter, an	
20	individual must meet all of the following:	
21	(1) Suffer eligible loss which is not covered by	
22	<u>insurance.</u>	
23	(2) Not be entitled to compensation for the eligible	
24	loss under eminent domain proceedings.	
25	(3) Have a household income which does not exceed 200%	
26	of the Federal poverty income guidelines.	
27	§ 7913. Application for and issuance of grant.	
28	(a) Application. The procedure for applying for a grant	
29	under this subchapter shall be as follows:	
30	(1) An individual must apply for a grant on a form	

1	<u>furnished by the agency, setting forth the facts establishing</u>
2	eligibility and certifying that if approved all funds
3	received will be used for purposes approved by the agency. An
4	application under this paragraph is subject to 18 Pa.C.S. §
5	4904 (relating to unsworn falsification to authorities). The
6	application must be submitted within 60 days following the
7	declaration of a disaster emergency. Only one individual may
8	apply per household.
9	(2) The agency shall investigate the application to
10	determine eligibility.
11	(3) Within 30 days of receipt of the application, the
12	agency shall make an eligibility determination. An
13	eligibility determination under this paragraph is a final
14	order of the agency subject to review under 2 Pa.C.S. Ch. 7
15	Subch. A (relating to judicial review of Commonwealth agency
16	action).
17	(b) Issuance. For each individual determined to be eligible
18	under subsection (a) (3), the agency shall verify the adjusted
19	loss. The maximum grant allowed under the Individual Disaster
20	Assistance Grant Program is \$10,000 or the adjusted loss,
21	whichever is less.
22	§ 7914. Use of grant funds.
23	Grant funds issued under the Individual Disaster Assistance
24	Grant Program may be used for the following disaster related
25	expenses:
26	(1) Assisting in repair or replacement of the owner
27	occupied primary residence, including mobile homes. Funds may
28	be used for removal of disaster generated debris but may not
29	be used for landscaping.

- 18 within the agency to provide grants to political subdivisions
- 19 and municipal authorities for assistance with repair of
- 20 <u>disaster-related damage in a disaster emergency area when the</u>
- 21 damages to public facilities are beyond the financial
- 22 capabilities of the political subdivision or authority.
- 23 § 7922. Eligibility.
- To be eligible for a grant under this subchapter, a political
- 25 subdivision or municipal authority must suffer eligible loss
- 26 which is not covered by insurance.
- 27 § 7923. Application for and issuance of grant.
- 28 (a) Application. -- The procedure for applying for a grant
- 29 <u>under this subchapter shall be as follows:</u>
- 30 (1) A political subdivision or municipal authority must

- 1 apply for a grant on a form furnished by the agency, setting
- 2 <u>forth the facts establishing eligibility and certifying that</u>
- 3 <u>if approved all funds received will be used for purposes</u>
- 4 approved by the agency. An application under this paragraph
- 5 <u>is subject to 18 Pa.C.S. § 4904 (relating to unsworn</u>
- 6 <u>falsification to authorities</u>). The application must be
- 7 <u>submitted within 60 days following the declaration of a</u>
- 8 <u>disaster emergency.</u>
- 9 (2) The agency shall investigate the application to
- 10 <u>determine eligibility.</u>

- 22 § 7924. GRANT FUNDS.
- 23 GRANTS UNDER THIS SUBCHAPTER SHALL BE MADE FROM FUNDS
- 24 APPROPRIATED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FOR THE PROGRAM AND FROM
- 25 OTHER FEDERAL OR STATE FUNDS THE AGENCY MAY RECEIVE FOR THE
- 26 PROGRAM. THE AGENCY MAY USE UP TO 3% OF AVAILABLE PROGRAM FUNDS
- 27 FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE PROGRAM.

2	(d) Lapse. At the end of each fiscal year, designated funds
3	which are not expended shall lapse to the General Fund.
4	§ 7932 7931. Powers and duties of agency.
5	The agency shall have the following duties and
6	responsibilities:
7	(1) Administer this chapter.
8	(2) Promulgate any regulations necessary to implement
9	and administer this chapter which include:
10	(i) Development of additional procedures or
11	requirements for the submission of grant applications.
12	(ii) Development of procedures to verify adjusted
13	loss.
14	(iii) Development of criteria for the determination
15	of the amount of assistance to be given to an individual <
