1 2 3 4	Amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for grants to municipal fire and emergency services organizations; and imposing a pyrotechnic public safety fee.
5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:

- 6 This chapter relates to grants to municipal fire and
- 7 <u>emergency services organizations.</u>
- 8 § 7902. Definitions.
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 10 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 12 "Advanced life support services." The advanced prehospital
- 13 and interhospital emergency medical care of serious illness or
- 14 <u>injury by appropriately trained health professionals and by</u>
- 15 certified EMT-paramedics.
- 16 "Agency." The Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency.
- 17 <u>"Basic life support services." Prehospital or interhospital</u>
- 18 emergency medical care and management of illness or injury
- 19 performed by specially trained and certified or licensed
- 20 personnel.
- 21 <u>"Commissioner."</u> The State Fire Commissioner.
- 22 "Facility." A structure or portion thereof intended for the
- 23 purpose of storage or protection of firefighting apparatus,
- 24 ambulances and rescue vehicles and related equipment and gear.
- 25 The term does not include meeting halls, social halls, social
- 26 rooms, lounges or any other facility not directly related to
- 27 <u>firefighting or the furnishing of ambulance or rescue services.</u>
- 28 "Grant program." The Municipal Fire and Emergency Services
- 29 Organization Grant Program established in Subchapter B (relating
- 30 to Municipal Fire and Emergency Services Organizations Grant

- 1 Program).
- 2 "Invalid coach." A vehicle which is primarily maintained,
- 3 operated and intended to be used for routine transport of
- 4 persons who are convalescent or otherwise nonambulatory and do
- 5 <u>not ordinarily require emergency medical treatment while in</u>
- 6 transit. The vehicles will not be considered ambulance or
- 7 <u>emergency medical service vehicles.</u>
- 8 "Municipal fire and emergency services organization." As
- 9 follows:
- 10 (1) A fire department, ambulance service or rescue squad
- 11 established, operated and funded by a municipality within
- this Commonwealth which meets all of the following:
- 13 (i) Provides fire protection or emergency services.
- 14 (ii) Has personnel which consists of all paid
- 15 <u>employees or a combination of paid employees and unpaid</u>
- 16 volunteers.
- 17 (iii) Provides 24-hour, 365-days-per-year staffing
- by full-time, paid employees.
- 19 <u>(2) Emergency services provided by a municipal fire and</u>
- 20 emergency services organization may include:
- 21 (i) Ambulance services, which may include basic life
- 22 support or advanced life support services and the
- 23 <u>transportation of patients within this Commonwealth.</u>
- 24 (ii) Rescue services, which may include response to
- 25 fire, vehicle accidents and water rescue efforts.
- 26 (3) The term does not include any corporation,
- association or organization that is primarily engaged in the
- operation of invalid coaches which are intended for the
- 29 routine transport of persons who are convalescent or
- 30 otherwise nonambulatory and do not ordinarily require

Establishment. 10 The Municipal Fire and Emergency Services Organization Grant Program is established and shall be administered by the agency 11 12 in consultation with the commissioner. Grants provided under 13 this program shall be used to improve and enhance the 14 capabilities of municipal fire and emergency services organizations to provide services. 15 16 § 7912. Publication and notice. 17 The agency shall publish notice of the grant program 18 availability through the Legislative Reference Bureau for 19 publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin: 20 (1) within 30 days of June 28, 2013, for the fiscal year 21 beginning July 1, 2013; and 22 (2) by August 8 for fiscal years beginning after June 23 30, 2014. 24 § 7913. Award of grants. 25 (a) Authorization. -- The agency is authorized to make a grant 26 award to each municipal fire and emergency services organization for the following: 27 (1) Construction and renovation of the municipal fire 28 29 and emergency services organization's facility and purchase 30 or repair of fixtures and furnishings necessary to maintain

- or improve the capability of the organization to provide services.
- 3 (2) Repair of equipment or purchase thereof.
- 4 (3) Debt reduction associated with paragraph (1) or (2).
- 5 <u>(4) Training and certification of members.</u>
- 6 (b) Limits.--
- 7 (1) Except as provided in paragraph (3), grants shall be
- 8 <u>not less than \$2,500 and not more than \$15,000 per municipal</u>
- 9 <u>fire and emergency services organization company.</u>
- 10 (2) Grants may be awarded on a pro rata basis if the
- 11 total dollar amount of the approved application exceeds the
- 12 <u>amount of funds appropriated by the General Assembly for this</u>
- 13 <u>purpose</u>.
- 14 (3) In a municipality where there are two or more
- municipal fire and emergency services organizations and if
- two or more municipal fire and emergency services
- 17 organizations consolidated their use of equipment,
- firefighters and services within five years preceding the
- 19 date of the current year application submission deadline, the
- 20 consolidated entity shall be deemed eliqible to receive a
- 21 grant not to exceed the amount of the combined total for
- 22 which the individual companies would have been eliqible had
- they not consolidated.
- 24 (c) Time for filing application and agency action. --
- 25 (1) Within 30 days of June 28, 2013, for the fiscal year
- beginning July 1, 2013, and by September 1 of each year
- 27 thereafter, the agency shall provide written instructions for
- grants under this chapter to the president of every municipal
- 29 fire and emergency services organization in this
- 30 Commonwealth.

- 1 (2) Within 45 days of June 28, 2013, for the fiscal year
- beginning July 1, 2013, and by September 8 of each year
- 3 thereafter, the agency shall provide applications to the
- 4 president of every municipal fire and emergency services
- 5 <u>organization. Municipal fire and emergency services</u>
- 6 organizations seeking grants under this chapter shall submit
- 7 <u>completed applications to the agency. The application period</u>
- 8 <u>shall remain open for 45 days each year. The agency shall act</u>
- 9 to approve or disapprove applications within 60 days of the
- 10 application submission deadline each year. Applications which
- 11 <u>have not been approved or disapproved by the agency within 60</u>
- days after the close of the application period each year
- shall be deemed approved.
- 14 (d) Eligibility. -- To receive grant funds under this chapter,
- 15 <u>a municipal fire and emergency services organization shall have</u>
- 16 actively responded to one or more fire or rescue emergencies
- 17 during the previous calendar year and must have signed and be
- 18 under an agreement to actively participate in the Pennsylvania
- 19 Fire Information Reporting System which is administered by the
- 20 agency.

- 27 <u>(a) Assessment.--There shall be assessed upon each separate</u>
- 28 sale at retail of consumer fireworks sold at facilities licensed
- 29 under the act of May 15, 1939 (P.L.134, No.65), referred to as
- 30 the Fireworks Law, a fee equal to 25% of the purchase price of

- 1 the consumer fireworks.
- 2 (b) Distribution. -- Money collected as a result of the fee
- 3 imposed under subsection (a) shall be distributed as follows:
- 4 (1) One million dollars shall be appropriated annually
- 5 to fund grants to eligible municipal fire and emergency
- 6 services organizations in accordance with this chapter.
- 7 (2) Remaining funds shall be allocated in accordance
- 8 <u>with section 7833(b) (relating to allocation of appropriated</u>
- 9 funds).
- 10 § 7922. Prohibition.
- No money from the appropriation under section 7921(b)
- 12 (relating to pyrotechnic public safety fee) for municipal fire
- 13 and emergency services organization grants may be used for
- 14 expenses or costs incurred by the agency for the administration
- 15 of the grant program authorized under Subchapter B (relating to
- 16 Municipal Fire and Emergency Services Organization Grant
- 17 Program).

- 24 The authority of the agency to award grants under Subchapter
- 25 B (relating to Municipal Fire and Emergency Services
- 26 Organization Grant Program) shall expire June 30, 2022.
- 27 § 7932. Special provisions.
- 28 (a) Claim. -- An applicant for a grant under this chapter who
- 29 <u>failed to return a signed agreement for the preceding year shall</u>
- 30 not be permitted to apply for a grant in the current year unless

- 1 the applicant has provided the commissioner with a reasonable
- 2 written explanation as to why it did not claim its grant.
- 3 (b) Demonstration. -- An applicant for a grant under this
- 4 <u>chapter must demonstrate that it complied with all of the terms</u>
- 5 of its grant agreement in the previous year regarding the use of
- 6 the grant money it received in previous years or it shall not be
- 7 <u>eliqible to receive a grant in the current year.</u>
- 8 (c) Approval. -- An applicant shall not be approved for a
- 9 grant to be used for purposes other than those stated in section
- 10 7913(a) (relating to award of grants).
- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
