AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6	Providing for the creation of a major watershed improvement program, for establishment of a verified TMDL parameter credit program, for the powers and duties of the Department of Environmental Protection and the Pennsylvania Infrastructure Investment Authority and for completion of a study by the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee.
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. Short title.
10	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Major
11	Watershed Improvement Act.
12	Section 2. Definitions.
13	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
14	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
15	context clearly indicates otherwise:
16	"Board." The Environmental Quality Board.
17	"Budget Office." The Governor's Office of the Budget.
18	"Department." The Department of Environmental Protection of
19	the Commonwealth.

1 "Fund." The Major Watershed Improvement Fund.

2 "Major watershed." As follows:

3 (1) The following watersheds located in this
4 Commonwealth and designated by the Department of
5 Environmental Protection as major watersheds:

- (i) Delaware.
- 7 (ii) Genesee.
- 8 (iii) Lake Erie.
- 9 (iv) Ohio.

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- 10 (v) Potomac.
- 11 (vi) Susquehanna.

12 (2) A watershed located in this Commonwealth that may be
13 designated as a major watershed on or after the effective
14 date of this section.

15 "Nutrient." Nitrogen or phosphorus.

16 "Participating authority." A water, sewer, water and sewer 17 or storm water management authority that serves a participating 18 municipality.

19 "Participating municipality." A city, borough, incorporated 20 town, township or home rule municipality identified by the 21 Department of Environmental Protection as being wholly or 22 partially located within a major watershed. The term does not 23 include a county.

24 "PENNVEST." The Pennsylvania Infrastructure Investment25 Authority.

26 "Program." The Major Watershed Improvement Program.

27 "TMDL." Total maximum daily load.

28 "TMDL parameter." Nutrient or sediment for which a TMDL has 29 been established or approved by the United States Environmental 30 Protection Agency under section 303 of the Water Pollution

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Control Act (62 Stat. 1155, 33 U.S.C. § 1313) and made
 applicable to a major watershed.

3 "TMDL parameter credit." The unit of compliance that 4 corresponds with a verified pound of reduction of a TMDL 5 parameter.

6 "Verified TMDL parameter credit." The unit of compliance
7 that corresponds with a verified pound of reduction of a TMDL
8 parameter as determined by the department.

9 "Water year." The 12-month period beginning October 1 of10 each calendar year.

11 Section 3. Major Watershed Improvement Program.

(a) Establishment.--There is established a Major Watershed
Improvement Program which shall consist of the purchase of
verified TMDL parameter credits by PENNVEST through a program
administered by the department and PENNVEST.

16 (b) Contracts with TMDL parameter credit sellers.--

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(1) The following shall apply:

18 (i) No later than 30 days following the publication 19 of temporary regulations by the board under section 5 and 20 no later than June 1 of each year thereafter when 21 required or necessary to meet an unmet TMDL parameter, 22 the department shall publish in the Pennsylvania Bulletin 23 a notice containing an updated forecast of the unmet TMDL 24 parameter planning targets for future water years 25 commencing the year after the date of publication.

(ii) No later than 60 days following publication of
the notice under subparagraph (i), PENNVEST shall issue,
in consultation with the department, a request for
proposals under 62 Pa.C.S. Pt. I (relating to
Commonwealth Procurement Code) for long-term purchase of

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1 verified TMDL parameter credits from interested parties, 2 including private entities, participating authorities and 3 participating municipalities, in order to meet the unmet TMDL parameter planning targets for those water years 4 5 included in the notice, as projected by the department 6 and contained in impaired surface waters listings and 7 Total Maximum Daily Load amounts in any watershed 8 implementation plan required on or after the effective date of this section by the United States Environmental 9 10 Protection Agency under the Water Pollution Control Act (62 Stat. 1155, 33 U.S.C. § 1251 et seq.). 11

(iii) A request for proposal under subparagraph (ii) shall be for a minimum term of 10 years and shall allow sufficient time for the delivery of verified reductions of TMDL parameters consistent with the time frame necessary for the permitting and development of public or private projects.

18 (2) Factors to be considered as part of the criteria for
19 evaluation of responses received to a request for proposals
20 and the weighted percentage to be applied to each factor
21 shall be included by the department in temporary regulations
22 published under section 5 and in final regulations and shall
23 include:

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(i) Cost.

(ii) Environmental and recreational benefits
resulting from the TMDL parameter to this Commonwealth
and local communities, including verified TMDL parameter
reductions to freshwater resources of this Commonwealth
and the applicable major watershed.

30 (iii) Additional criteria determined relevant by the 20130SB0994PN1169 - 4 - department.

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(c) Participation in program.--

(1) Nutrients, which have been identified as a TMDL
parameter where significant cost savings can be achieved
pursuant to a Legislative Budget and Finance Committee study
released in January 2013 and titled "A Cost Effective
Alternative Approach to Meeting Pennsylvania's Chesapeake Bay
Nutrient Reduction Targets," shall be included in the
program.

10 (2) Additional major watersheds and TMDL parameters may 11 be added to the program by the department upon publication in 12 the Pennsylvania Bulletin of a notice which includes a 13 statement by the department of the rationale for each 14 addition and, for TMDL parameters, an analysis indicating 15 that the inclusion of TMDL parameters in the program will 16 result in cost savings as a result of competitive bidding. Section 4. Major Watershed Improvement Fund. 17

(a) Establishment.--There is created within the State
Treasury a special fund to be known as the Major Watershed
Improvement Fund.

21 (b) Deposits.--The following shall be deposited into the 22 fund:

(1) any appropriation made to the program; and
(2) Any other existing or future Federal or State
appropriation or other money determined by the department, in
consultation with the Budget Office, to be available for the
program.

(c) Use.--Money in the fund shall be used by PENNVEST for the purchase of verified TMDL parameter credits under section 30 3(b).

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1 Issuance of request for proposals. -- Any request for a (d) 2 proposal under section 3 may only be issued upon certification 3 by the department and the Budget Office that money has been identified and is available to be deposited in the fund to pay 4 for costs associated with issuance of a request for proposals, 5 including payments for long-term purchase of verified TMDL 6 parameter credits. A notice containing the certification shall 7 8 be published by the department in the Pennsylvania Bulletin no later than 30 days following issuance of the certification. 9 10 Section 5. Temporary regulations.

11 (a) Promulgation. -- In order to facilitate the prompt 12 implementation of this act, temporary regulations may be promulgated by the board under this section. Prior to adoption, 13 14 a draft of the temporary regulations shall be published in the 15 Pennsylvania Bulletin and subject to public comment for a period 16 of 30 days. Following completion of the public comment period 17 and approval by the board, temporary regulations shall be 18 published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin. The temporary 19 regulations shall expire no later than two years following their 20 publication. The temporary regulations shall not be subject to:

21 (1) Sections 201, 202, 203, 204 and 205 of the act of 22 July 31, 1968 (P.L.769, No.240), referred to as the 23 Commonwealth Documents Law.

(2) The act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633, No.181), known as
the Regulatory Review Act.

26 (3) Sections 204(b) and 301(10) of the act of October
27 15, 1980 (P.L.950, No.164), known as the Commonwealth
28 Attorneys Act.

(b) Expiration.--The authority of the board to adopttemporary regulations under subsection (a) shall expire two

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years after the effective date of this section. Regulations
 adopted after this period shall be promulgated as provided by
 law.

4 (c) Draft.--The board shall publish draft temporary
5 regulations pursuant to subsection (a) in the Pennsylvania
6 Bulletin no later than 60 days following publication of the
7 notice required under section 4(d).

8 Section 6. Legislative Budget and Finance Committee funding9 study.

10 (a) Scope.--The Legislative Budget and Finance Committee 11 shall conduct a study of possible sources of funding for the 12 program in addition to sources authorized to be deposited into 13 the fund under section 4(b).

14 Report and recommendations.--A report and (b) recommendations shall be presented by the Legislative Budget and 15 16 Finance Committee to the department, PENNVEST, the Environmental 17 Resources and Energy Committee, Agriculture and Rural Affairs 18 Committee and Local Government Committee of the Senate and the 19 Environmental Resources and Energy Committee, Agriculture and Rural Affairs Committee and Local Government Committee of the 20 House of Representatives within six months following the 21 22 effective date of this section.

23 Section 20. Effective date.

24 This act shall take effect in 30 days.

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
