## AN ACT

1 2 3	Providing for duties of certain institutions of higher education relating to services for veterans and for the powers and duties of the Department of Education.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Short title.
7	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Developing
8	Opportunities in Veterans' Education Act.
9	Section 2. Definitions.
10	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
11	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
12	context clearly indicates otherwise:
13	"Department." The Department of Education of the
14	Commonwealth.
15	"Institution of higher education." A public or private
16	university, college or community college in this Commonwealth.
17	Section 3. Duties of institutions of higher education.

1 An institution of higher education shall:

(1) Designate a single point of contact, from whom
service members and veterans can receive help with admission,
benefits, peer mentoring and other academic, social, personal
and financial needs.

6 (2) Post its service members' and veterans' services and 7 programs on its publicly accessible Internet website, in its 8 campus brochure and other readily accessible information 9 sources.

10 (3) Post its service members and veterans withdrawal 11 policies for mobilization and deployment and credit transfer 12 on its publicly accessible Internet website and other readily 13 accessible points, and use an "M" on formal transcripts to 14 denote a mobilization. The use of "withdrawal" or 15 "incomplete" on the formal transcripts of mobilized service 16 members and veterans is prohibited.

17 (4) Track service members and veterans through the
18 application and enrollment process and report the number of
19 service members and veterans enrolled to the Office of
20 Veterans Services within the department by December 31 of
21 each year.

(5) Use guidelines developed by the department to adopt policies for the awarding of academic credit to service members and veterans for military education, training and experience in accordance with the Guide to the Evaluation of Educational Experiences in the Armed Services, published by the American Council on Education.

28 Section 4. Duties of department.

29The Office of Veterans Services in the department shall:30(1)(1)Track and report the number of service members and

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veterans enrolled at institutions of higher education to the Veterans Affairs and Emergency Preparedness Committee and the Education Committee of the Senate and the Veterans Affairs and Emergency Preparedness Committee and the Education Committee of the House of Representatives by June 30 of each year.

7 (2) Post on its Internet website its best practices8 manual on veterans education.

9 (3) Develop a program to certify institutions of higher 10 education as "Devoted to Our Veterans" Campuses based on 11 their military-friendly or veteran-supportive programs and 12 services.

13 (4) Develop guidelines for institutions of higher
14 education to award academic credit to certain students for
15 military education, training and experience.
16 Section 5. "Devoted to Our Veterans" Campuses.

17 (a) General rule. -- An institution of higher education may 18 submit an application to the department to be certified as a 19 "Devoted to Our Veterans" Campus. The department shall maintain 20 a list of certified "Devoted to Our Veterans" campuses on its publicly accessible Internet website. The department shall make 21 a reasonable effort to notify institutions of higher education 22 23 that they can be certified as a "Devoted to Our Veterans" 24 Campus.

(b) Criteria.--An institution of higher education shall be certified as a "Devoted to Our Veterans" Campus if the institution of higher education submits an application to the department and demonstrates at least three of the following criteria:

30 (1) A campus survey of service members and student 20130SB1004PN1271 - 3 - 1 service members and veterans to identify needs.

2 (2) A campus steering committee consisting of student3 veterans, faculty and staff to identify needs, make
4 recommendations for improvements and share best practices for
5 supporting student service members and veterans.

6 (3) Sensitivity and awareness training on military and 7 veterans' culture, including issues related to Traumatic 8 Brain Injury, Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder, suicide and 9 physical and mental disabilities.

10 (4) Student-veteran orientation programs, including 11 student-veteran guides for the first day on campus, an 12 optional student-veterans' orientation session and at least 13 one optional veterans-only course taught by a veteran or 14 trained volunteer on veterans' issues.

15 (5) Peer mentoring and peer support programs for16 student-veterans and service members.

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(6) Outreach strategies to local military bases.

18 (7) A centrally located, one-stop resource and student
19 center on campus for student-veterans, their families and
20 student family members of the United States Armed Forces who
21 are currently deployed.

(8) Community-based collaboration efforts to allow the
 private sector to support veterans resource centers through
 financial aid and in-kind gifts.

25 Section 6. Effective date.

26 This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
