1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
2 Statutes, IN GENERAL PROVISIONS, FURTHER PROVIDING FOR <--
3 DEFINITIONS; IN CERTIFICATE OF TITLE AND SECURITY INTERESTS,
4 FURTHER PROVIDING FOR TRANSFER OF OWNERSHIP OF VEHICLES USED
5 FOR HUMAN HABITATION; IN COMMERCIAL DRIVERS, FURTHER
6 PROVIDING FOR DEFINITIONS, AND PROVIDING FOR TEXTING WHILE
7 DRIVING AND FOR HANDHELD MOBILE TELEPHONE; IN MISCELLANEOUS <--
8 PROVISIONS, FURTHER PROVIDING FOR ACCIDENTS INVOLVING DEATH
9 OR PERSONAL INJURY; AND, in size, weight and load, further <--
10 providing for length of vehicles, FOR CONDITIONS OF PERMITS <--
11 AND SECURITY FOR DAMAGES AND FOR PERMITS FOR MOVEMENT OF A
12 MOBILE HOME OR A MODULAR HOUSING UNIT AND MODULAR HOUSING
13 UNDERCARRIAGE; AND MAKING AN EDITORIAL CHANGE. <--

14 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
15 hereby enacts as follows:

22 § 102. DEFINITIONS.

1 SUBJECT TO ADDITIONAL DEFINITIONS CONTAINED IN SUBSEQUENT
2 PROVISIONS OF THIS TITLE WHICH ARE APPLICABLE TO SPECIFIC
3 PROVISIONS OF THIS TITLE, THE FOLLOWING WORDS AND PHRASES WHEN
4 USED IN THIS TITLE SHALL HAVE, UNLESS THE CONTEXT CLEARLY
5 INDICATES OTHERWISE, THE MEANINGS GIVEN TO THEM IN THIS SECTION:

7 "MANUFACTURED HOME." A MANUFACTURED HOME AS DEFINED IN
8 SECTION 603(6) OF THE NATIONAL MANUFACTURED HOUSING CONSTRUCTION
9 AND SAFETY STANDARDS ACT OF 1974 (PUBLIC LAW 93-383, 42 U.S.C.
10 § 5402(6)). THE TERM INCLUDES A MOBILE HOME.

12 SECTION 2. SECTION 1111.1(A) OF TITLE 75 OF THE PENNSYLVANIA
13 CONSOLIDATED STATUTES, ADDED APRIL 18, 2014 (P.L.430, NO.36), IS
14 AMENDED TO READ:

15 § 1111.1. TRANSFER OF OWNERSHIP OF VEHICLES USED FOR HUMAN
16 HABITATION.

17 (A) TAX STATUS CERTIFICATION.--IF A MOBILE HOME OR
18 MANUFACTURED HOME THAT HAS BEEN ANCHORED TO THE GROUND TO
19 FACILITATE CONNECTIONS WITH ELECTRICITY, WATER AND SEWERAGE, AND
20 PREVIOUSLY TITLED TO A PERSON USING THE MOBILE HOME OR
21 MANUFACTURED HOME AS A RESIDENCE, IS OFFERED FOR SALE OR
22 TRANSFER, THE TRANSFEROR SHALL OBTAIN A TAX STATUS CERTIFICATION
23 FROM THE TAX CLAIM BUREAU OF THE COUNTY IN WHICH THE MOBILE HOME
24 OR MANUFACTURED HOME IS SITUATED SHOWING THE REAL ESTATE TAXES
25 DUE ON THE MOBILE HOME OR MANUFACTURED HOME, AS SHOWN BY THE
26 BUREAU'S RECORDS AS OF THE DATE OF THE CERTIFICATION. THE TAX
27 STATUS CERTIFICATION SHALL BE PROVIDED TO THE TRANSFEREE AND THE
28 DEPARTMENT IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE TRANSFER OF THE MOBILE HOME
29 OR MANUFACTURED HOME AND SHALL INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING:

30 (1) THE PARCEL NUMBER ASSIGNED TO THE VEHICLE.

1 (2) THE AMOUNT OF CURRENT OR DELINQUENT TAXES OWED FROM
2 THE PARCEL NUMBER.

3 (3) THE DATE UPON WHICH A TAX FOR THE PARCEL NUMBER WILL
4 ACCRUE AND THE TAXING PERIOD THAT THE TAX WILL COVER.

5 (4) THE ADDRESSES AND TELEPHONE NUMBERS OF THE TAX
6 COLLECTION AUTHORITY AND TAX CLAIM BUREAU OR EQUIVALENT
7 OFFICE.

9 SECTION 3. PARAGRAPH (4) OF THE DEFINITION OF "SERIOUS
10 TRAFFIC VIOLATION" IN SECTION 1603 OF TITLE 75 IS AMENDED TO
11 READ:

12 § 1603. DEFINITIONS.

13 THE FOLLOWING WORDS AND PHRASES WHEN USED IN THIS CHAPTER
14 SHALL HAVE THE MEANINGS GIVEN TO THEM IN THIS SECTION UNLESS THE

19 (4) ANY VIOLATION OF SECTION 1606(A) (RELATING TO
20 REQUIREMENT FOR COMMERCIAL DRIVER'S LICENSE), 1621(A)
21 (RELATING TO TEXTING WHILE DRIVING), 1622(A) (RELATING TO
22 HANDHELD MOBILE TELEPHONE), 3305 (RELATING TO LIMITATIONS ON
23 OVERTAKING ON LEFT), 3306 (RELATING TO LIMITATIONS ON DRIVING
24 ON LEFT SIDE OF ROADWAY), 3307 (RELATING TO NO-PASSING
25 ZONES), 3309(1), (2) OR (4) (RELATING TO DRIVING ON ROADWAYS
26 LANED FOR TRAFFIC), 3310 (RELATING TO FOLLOWING TOO CLOSELY),
27 3326 (RELATING TO DUTY OF DRIVER IN CONSTRUCTION AND

1 SECTION 4. TITLE 75 IS AMENDED BY ADDING SECTIONS TO READ:
2 § 1621. TEXTING WHILE DRIVING.

3 (A) PROHIBITION.--EXCEPT AS PROVIDED UNDER SUBSECTION (C), A
4 DRIVER MAY NOT ENGAGE IN TEXTING WHILE DRIVING A COMMERCIAL
5 MOTOR VEHICLE OR MOTOR CARRIER VEHICLE.

6 (B) EMPLOYER.--EXCEPT AS PROVIDED UNDER SUBSECTION (C), AN
7 EMPLOYER MAY NOT PERMIT OR REQUIRE A DRIVER OF THE EMPLOYER TO
8 ENGAGE IN TEXTING WHILE DRIVING A COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLE OR
9 MOTOR CARRIER VEHICLE.

10 (C) EMERGENCY USE EXCEPTION.--TEXTING WHILE DRIVING SHALL BE
11 PERMISSIBLE BY A DRIVER OF A COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLE OR MOTOR
12 CARRIER VEHICLE IF NECESSARY TO COMMUNICATE WITH A LAW
13 ENFORCEMENT OFFICIAL OR OTHER EMERGENCY SERVICE.

14 (D) PENALTIES.--

15 (1) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES SUBSECTION (A) COMMITS A
16 SUMMARY OFFENSE AND SHALL, UPON CONVICTION, BE SENTENCED TO
17 PAY A FINE OF \$100.

18 (2) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES SUBSECTION (B) COMMITS A
19 SUMMARY OFFENSE AND SHALL, UPON CONVICTION, BE SENTENCED TO
20 PAY A FINE OF \$500.

21 (E) DEFINITIONS.--AS USED IN THIS SECTION, THE FOLLOWING
22 WORDS AND PHRASES SHALL HAVE THE MEANINGS GIVEN TO THEM IN THIS
23 SUBSECTION:

24 "DRIVING." OPERATING A COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLE OR MOTOR
25 CARRIER VEHICLE ON A HIGHWAY, WITH THE MOTOR RUNNING, INCLUDING
26 WHILE THE COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLE OR MOTOR CARRIER VEHICLE IS
27 TEMPORARILY STATIONARY BECAUSE OF TRAFFIC, A TRAFFIC CONTROL
28 DEVICE OR OTHER MOMENTARY DELAY. THE TERM DOES NOT INCLUDE
29 OPERATING A COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLE OR MOTOR CARRIER VEHICLE
30 WITH OR WITHOUT THE MOTOR RUNNING IF THE DRIVER MOVED THE

1 VEHICLE TO THE SIDE OF OR OFF OF A HIGHWAY AND HALTED IN A
2 LOCATION WHERE THE VEHICLE CAN SAFELY REMAIN STATIONARY.

3 "ELECTRONIC DEVICE." AN ELECTRONIC DEVICE INCLUDES, BUT IS
4 NOT LIMITED TO, A CELLULAR TELEPHONE, PERSONAL DIGITAL
5 ASSISTANT, PAGER, COMPUTER OR ANY OTHER DEVICE USED TO INPUT,
6 WRITE, SEND, RECEIVE OR READ TEXT.

7 "TEXTING." MANUALLY ENTERING ALPHANUMERIC TEXT INTO, OR
8 READING TEXT FROM, AN ELECTRONIC DEVICE. THE FOLLOWING SHALL
9 APPLY:

10 (1) THE TERM INCLUDES, BUT IS NOT LIMITED TO, SHORT
11 MESSAGE SERVICE, E-MAILING, INSTANT MESSAGING, A COMMAND OR
12 REQUEST TO ACCESS AN INTERNET WEB PAGE, PRESSING MORE THAN A
13 SINGLE BUTTON TO INITIATE OR TERMINATE A VOICE COMMUNICATION
14 USING A MOBILE TELEPHONE OR ENGAGING IN ANY OTHER FORM OF
15 ELECTRONIC TEXT RETRIEVAL OR ENTRY, FOR PRESENT OR FUTURE
16 COMMUNICATION.

17 (2) THE TERM DOES NOT INCLUDE:

18 (I) INPUTTING, SELECTING OR READING INFORMATION ON A
19 GLOBAL POSITIONING SYSTEM OR NAVIGATION SYSTEM.

20 (II) PRESSING A SINGLE BUTTON TO INITIATE OR
21 TERMINATE A VOICE COMMUNICATION USING A MOBILE TELEPHONE.

22 (III) USING A DEVICE CAPABLE OF PERFORMING MULTIPLE
23 FUNCTIONS, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, FLEET
24 MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS, DISPATCHING DEVICES, CITIZENS BAND
25 RADIOS AND MUSIC PLAYERS, FOR A PURPOSE THAT IS NOT
26 PROHIBITED BY THIS SECTION.

27 § 1622. HANDHELD MOBILE TELEPHONE.

28 (A) COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLE.-- EXCEPT AS PROVIDED UNDER
29 SUBSECTION (C), A DRIVER MAY NOT USE A HANDHELD MOBILE TELEPHONE
30 WHILE DRIVING A COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLE OR MOTOR CARRIER

1 VEHICLE.

2 (B) EMPLOYER.--EXCEPT AS PROVIDED UNDER SUBSECTION (C), AN
3 EMPLOYER MAY NOT PERMIT OR REQUIRE A DRIVER OF THE EMPLOYER TO
4 USE A HANDHELD MOBILE TELEPHONE WHILE DRIVING A COMMERCIAL MOTOR
5 VEHICLE OR A MOTOR CARRIER VEHICLE.

6 (C) EMERGENCY USE EXCEPTION.--USING A HANDHELD MOBILE
7 TELEPHONE SHALL BE PERMISSIBLE BY A DRIVER OF A COMMERCIAL MOTOR
8 VEHICLE OR MOTOR CARRIER VEHICLE IF NECESSARY TO COMMUNICATE
9 WITH A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICIAL OR OTHER EMERGENCY SERVICE.

10 (D) PENALTIES.--

11 (1) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES SUBSECTION (A) COMMITS A
12 SUMMARY OFFENSE AND SHALL, UPON CONVICTION, BE SENTENCED TO
13 PAY A FINE OF \$100.

14 (2) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES SUBSECTION (B) COMMITS A
15 SUMMARY OFFENSE AND SHALL, UPON CONVICTION, BE SENTENCED TO
16 PAY A FINE OF \$500.

17 (E) DEFINITIONS.--AS USED IN THIS SECTION, THE FOLLOWING
18 WORDS AND PHRASES SHALL HAVE THE MEANINGS GIVEN TO THEM IN THIS
19 SUBSECTION:

20 "DRIVING." OPERATING A COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLE OR MOTOR
21 CARRIER VEHICLE ON A HIGHWAY, WITH THE MOTOR RUNNING, INCLUDING
22 WHILE THE COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLE OR MOTOR CARRIER VEHICLE IS
23 TEMPORARILY STATIONARY BECAUSE OF TRAFFIC, A TRAFFIC CONTROL
24 DEVICE OR OTHER MOMENTARY DELAY. THE TERM DOES NOT INCLUDE
25 OPERATING A COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLE OR MOTOR CARRIER VEHICLE
26 WITH OR WITHOUT THE MOTOR RUNNING IF THE DRIVER MOVED THE
27 VEHICLE TO THE SIDE OF OR OFF OF A HIGHWAY AND HALTED IN A
28 LOCATION WHERE THE VEHICLE CAN SAFELY REMAIN STATIONARY.

29 "MOBILE TELEPHONE." A MOBILE COMMUNICATION DEVICE WHICH USES
30 A COMMERCIAL MOBILE RADIO SERVICE, AS DEFINED IN 47 CFR § 20.3

1 (RELATING TO DEFINITIONS). THE TERM DOES NOT INCLUDE TWO-WAY OR
2 CITIZENS BAND RADIO SERVICES.

3 "USE A HANDHELD MOBILE TELEPHONE." AS FOLLOWS:

4 (1) USING AT LEAST ONE HAND TO HOLD A MOBILE TELEPHONE
5 TO CONDUCT A VOICE COMMUNICATION.

6 (2) DIALING OR ANSWERING A MOBILE TELEPHONE BY PRESSING
7 MORE THAN A SINGLE BUTTON.

8 (3) REACHING FOR A MOBILE TELEPHONE IN A MANNER THAT
9 REQUIRES A DRIVER TO MANEUVER SO THAT THE DRIVER IS NO LONGER
10 IN A SEATED DRIVING POSITION, RESTRAINED BY A SEAT BELT THAT
11 IS INSTALLED IN ACCORDANCE WITH 49 CFR § 393.93 (RELATING TO
12 SEATS, SEAT BELT ASSEMBLIES, AND SEAT BELT ASSEMBLY
13 ANCHORAGES) AND ADJUSTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE VEHICLE
14 MANUFACTURER'S INSTRUCTIONS.

15 SECTION 5. SECTION 1944 OF TITLE 75, AMENDED NOVEMBER 25,
16 2013 (P.L.974, NO.89), IS AMENDED TO READ:

17 § 1944. MOBILE HOMES, MODULAR HOUSING UNITS AND MODULAR HOUSING
18 UNDERCARRIAGES.

19 THE FEE FOR A SPECIAL HAULING PERMIT FOR A MOBILE HOME,
20 MODULAR HOUSING UNIT OR MODULAR HOUSING UNDERCARRIAGE WHICH
21 EXCEEDS THE MAXIMUM SIZE PRESCRIBED IN THIS TITLE BUT WHICH DOES
22 NOT EXCEED 14 FEET IN BODY WIDTH SHALL BE \$39. THE FEE FOR A
23 SPECIAL HAULING PERMIT FOR A MOBILE HOME OR MODULAR HOUSING
24 UNIT, AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 4973 (RELATING TO PERMITS FOR
25 MOVEMENT OF A MOBILE HOME, A MANUFACTURED HOME OR A MODULAR
26 HOUSING UNIT AND MODULAR HOUSING UNDERCARRIAGE), SHALL BE \$76.

27 SECTION 6. SECTIONS 3742(B) AND 4923(A) OF TITLE 75 ARE
28 AMENDED TO READ:

29 § 3742. ACCIDENTS INVOLVING DEATH OR PERSONAL INJURY.

1 (B) PENALTIES.--

2 (1) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION, ANY
3 PERSON VIOLATING THIS SECTION COMMITS A MISDEMEANOR OF THE
4 FIRST DEGREE.

5 (2) IF THE VICTIM SUFFERS SERIOUS BODILY INJURY, ANY
6 PERSON VIOLATING SUBSECTION (A) COMMITS A FELONY OF THE THIRD
7 DEGREE, AND THE SENTENCING COURT SHALL ORDER THE PERSON TO
8 SERVE A MINIMUM TERM OF IMPRISONMENT OF NOT LESS THAN 90 DAYS
9 AND A MANDATORY MINIMUM FINE OF \$1,000, NOTWITHSTANDING ANY
10 OTHER PROVISION OF LAW.

11 (3) (I) IF THE VICTIM DIES, ANY PERSON VIOLATING
12 SUBSECTION (A) COMMITS A FELONY OF THE SECOND DEGREE, AND
13 THE SENTENCING COURT SHALL ORDER THE PERSON TO SERVE A
14 MINIMUM TERM OF IMPRISONMENT OF NOT LESS THAN [ONE YEAR]
15 THREE YEARS AND A MANDATORY MINIMUM FINE OF \$2,500,
16 NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF LAW.

17 (II) IN ADDITION TO THE MINIMUM TERM OF IMPRISONMENT
18 PROVIDED FOR IN SUBPARAGRAPH (I), THE PENNSYLVANIA
19 COMMISSION ON SENTENCING SHALL PROVIDE WITHIN ITS
20 GUIDELINES A SENTENCING ENHANCEMENT IF THE VICTIM DIES AS
21 THE RESULT OF A VIOLATION OF SUBSECTION (A). THE
22 PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBPARAGRAPH SHALL NOT BE AN ELEMENT
23 OF THE CRIME, AND NOTICE OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS
24 SUBPARAGRAPH SHALL NOT BE REQUIRED PRIOR TO CONVICTION,
25 BUT REASONABLE NOTICE OF THE COMMONWEALTH'S INTENTION TO

29 § 4923. Length of vehicles.

30 (a) Motor vehicles.--

1 (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2), no motor
2 vehicle, including any load and bumpers, shall exceed an
3 overall length of 40 feet.

4 (2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to the following:

5 (i) A motor vehicle equipped with a boom or boomlike
6 device if the vehicle does not exceed 55 feet.

7 (ii) A bus, school bus or motor home which does not
8 exceed 45 feet.

9 (iii) An articulated bus which does not exceed 63
10 feet.

11 (iv) An automobile or boat transporter which does
12 not exceed 45 feet, exclusive of an overhang of not more
13 than three feet on the front and four feet on the rear.

15 SECTION 2 7. SECTION 4962(F.2) OF TITLE 75 IS AMENDED AND <--
16 THE SECTION IS AMENDED BY ADDING SUBSECTIONS TO READ:
17 § 4962. CONDITIONS OF PERMITS AND SECURITY FOR DAMAGES.

19 (F.2) ONE PILOT CAR.--VEHICLES GREATER THAN 13 FEET BUT
20 [LESS] NOT GREATER THAN 14 FEET IN BODY WIDTH, EVEN IF THE TOTAL
21 LENGTH OF THE VEHICLE OR COMBINATION, INCLUDING THE LOAD ON THE
22 COMBINATION, EXCEEDS 90 FEET BUT IS NOT IN EXCESS OF 120 FEET,
23 SHALL ONLY BE REQUIRED TO MAINTAIN ONE PILOT CAR. THE POSITION
24 OF THE PILOT CAR TO THE FRONT OR REAR OF THE PERMITTED VEHICLE
25 MAY BE DETERMINED BY THE DEPARTMENT.

27 (F.4) TRAVEL RESTRICTION.--A PERMITTED OVERSIZED VEHICLE MAY
28 NOT TRAVEL WITHIN 1,000 FEET OF ANOTHER PERMITTED OVERSIZED
29 VEHICLE TRAVELING IN THE SAME DIRECTION, UNLESS THE VEHICLE IS
30 ONE OF THE FOLLOWING:

1 (1) A MILITARY VEHICLE.
2 (2) A VEHICLE TRAVELING IN A CONSTRUCTION ZONE.
3 (3) A VEHICLE TRAVELING WITHIN 2,500 FEET OF A STOP
4 SIGN, TRAFFIC LIGHT OR ANY OTHER ~~TRAFFIC~~ TRAFFIC-CONTROL <--
5 SIGNAL OR EVENT THAT WOULD CAUSE EITHER VEHICLE TO COME TO A
6 STOP.

7 (F.5) TRANSPORT.--NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF THIS
8 TITLE TO THE CONTRARY, A PERMIT ISSUED UNDER SECTION 4961 OR
9 4973 (RELATING TO PERMITS FOR MOVEMENT OF A MOBILE HOME, A <--
10 MANUFACTURED HOME OR A MODULAR HOUSING UNIT AND MODULAR HOUSING
11 UNDERCARRIAGE) FOR THE MOVEMENT OF MANUFACTURED HOMES, MODULAR
12 HOMES, MOBILE HOMES, MANUFACTURED CONSTRUCTION UNITS OR MODULAR
13 HOUSING UNDERCARRIAGES SHALL PERMIT THE TRANSPORT OF MULTIPLE
14 SECTIONS OF HOMES, UNITS OR UNDERCARRIAGES OR ANY AND ALL
15 COMPONENTS NEEDED OR USED TO ASSEMBLE THE HOMES, UNITS OR
16 UNDERCARRIAGES, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, SHINGLES,
17 DORMERS, TRUSSES AND GABLE END WALLS, PROVIDED THAT THE MULTIPLE
