## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Observing March 14, 2013, as "Charter Day" in Pennsylvania.
- WHEREAS, On March 4, 1681, King Charles II of England granted
- 3 William Penn a charter for land in the New World to make up for
- 4 a large debt that the king owed to Penn's father; and
- 5 WHEREAS, William Penn had initially decided to name the land
- 6 "Sylvania," which in Latin means "woods" and to which King
- 7 Charles II added the prefix "Penn" to the name in honor of
- 8 William Penn's father, Admiral Sir William Penn, who had served
- 9 England as a rear admiral and vice admiral of Ireland, a vice
- 10 admiral of England, a general in the first Dutch War and great
- 11 captain commander under the Duke of York; and
- 12 WHEREAS, William Penn wrote a Frame of Government of
- 13 Pennsylvania that established a democratic system containing
- 14 full freedom of religion, fair trials using independent juries,

- 1 assemblies consisting of elected representatives of the people
- 2 and a separation of powers in the government, all ideas that
- 3 later formed the crux of the Constitution of the United States;
- 4 and
- 5 WHEREAS, William Penn described Pennsylvania as his "holy
- 6 experiment" and from it, he hoped, a nation based on justice
- 7 would grow; and
- 8 WHEREAS, William Penn's charter exists as the formal
- 9 beginning of the colony and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and
- 10 through it William Penn established the first example of
- 11 democracy in what would become the United States of America; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Our citizens benefit from learning more about the
- 13 overall history of this Commonwealth from its founding until
- 14 today and how the principles of governance within the
- 15 Commonwealth date back to the beliefs of William Penn; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The act of July 28, 1953 (P.L.676, No.210) provides
- 17 for the observance of March 14 of each year as Charter Day and
- 18 urges the people of this Commonwealth, the public schools and
- 19 other educational institutions and patriotic, religious,
- 20 historical and veterans' organizations to observe on that day
- 21 the anniversary of the execution of the Royal Charter by King
- 22 Charles II; and
- 23 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission,
- 24 the Pennsylvania State Archives and the State Historical Records
- 25 Advisory Board each works to inform our residents about the
- 26 Commonwealth's heritage, including sponsoring the 14th Annual
- 27 Charter Day event on Sunday, March 10, 2013, in the State Museum
- 28 of Pennsylvania; and
- 29 WHEREAS, This free event includes a presentation of the 1681
- 30 Charter as well as information about Penn's Great Law of 1682, a

- 1 William Penn reenactor, stories of Pennsylvania history and
- 2 other programs; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The charter is sometimes referred to as the
- 4 Commonwealth's "birth certificate" and the charter on display
- 5 was William Penn's personal copy; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The charter will be on display until March 17, 2013;
- 7 and
- 8 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania has 25 other State historic sites and
- 9 museums and numerous other historical organizations that
- 10 continue to operate, largely thanks to the assistance of
- 11 volunteers and other groups that have donated their money, time
- 12 and other resources so that residents can remain well informed
- 13 about the fabric of this Commonwealth's history; therefore be it
- RESOLVED, That the Senate observe March 14, 2013, as "Charter
- 15 Day" in Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 16 RESOLVED, That the residents, schools, other educational
- 17 institutions and patriotic, religious, historical and veterans
- 18 groups be urged to participate in the Charter Day activities
- 19 sponsored by the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission,
- 20 the Pennsylvania State Archives, the State Historical Records
- 21 Advisory Board, the 25 other State historic sites and museums or
- 22 those offered by any of the many other historical organizations
- 23 within this Commonwealth; and be it further
- 24 RESOLVED, That the volunteers and other residents who keep
- 25 history alive through their support and work for the
- 26 Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission, the Pennsylvania
- 27 State Archives, the State Historical Records Advisory Board, the
- 28 25 other State historic sites and museums or through the
- 29 numerous other historical organizations within this Commonwealth
- 30 be honored for their efforts.
