## A RESOLUTION

Designating the month of April 2013 as "Distracted Driving Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.

WHEREAS, Distracted driving is any activity that could divert a person's attention away from the primary task of driving; and

WHEREAS, All distractions endanger driver, passenger and bystander safety; and

WHEREAS, Distracted driving comes in various forms, including using a cell phone or other electronic device, eating and drinking, smoking, engaging in conversation and using a navigation system while driving; and

WHEREAS, Distracted driving is not confined to a single cause, age group, level of education or driver demographic; and WHEREAS, Motor vehicle accidents resulting from distracted driving caused 10,567 accidents in 2011, an increase of more than 350 accidents from 2010; and

WHEREAS, According to national statistics, 3,331 people were

killed in crashes involving a distracted driver and 387,000
people were injured in motor vehicle crashes involving a
distracted driver in 2011; and
    WHEREAS, The best way to end distracted driving is to educate
all Pennsylvanians about the danger it poses; therefore be it
    RESOLVED, That the Senate urge drivers to consider the lives
of others on the road and avoid distracted driving; and be it
further
    RESOLVED, That the Senate encourage parents, teens, teachers
and community leaders to discuss the risk of distracted driving;
and be it further
