A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of April 2013 as "Distracted Driving Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Distracted driving is any activity that could divert
- 4 a person's attention away from the primary task of driving; and
- 5 WHEREAS, All distractions endanger driver, passenger and
- 6 bystander safety; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Distracted driving comes in various forms, including
- 8 using a cell phone or other electronic device, eating and
- 9 drinking, smoking, engaging in conversation and using a
- 10 navigation system while driving; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Distracted driving is not confined to a single
- 12 cause, age group, level of education or driver demographic; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Motor vehicle accidents resulting from distracted
- 14 driving caused 10,567 accidents in 2011, an increase of more
- 15 than 350 accidents from 2010; and
- 16 WHEREAS, According to national statistics, 3,331 people were

- 1 killed in crashes involving a distracted driver and 387,000
- 2 people were injured in motor vehicle crashes involving a
- 3 distracted driver in 2011; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The best way to end distracted driving is to educate
- 5 all Pennsylvanians about the danger it poses; therefore be it
- 6 RESOLVED, That the Senate urge drivers to consider the lives
- 7 of others on the road and avoid distracted driving; and be it
- 8 further
- 9 RESOLVED, That the Senate encourage parents, teens, teachers
- 10 and community leaders to discuss the risk of distracted driving;
- 11 and be it further
- RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of April 2013
- 13 as "Distracted Driving Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
