## A RESOLUTION

- Directing the Joint State Government Commission to conduct a comprehensive study of the costs and efficiencies of the requirements under Pennsylvania's public construction laws.

  WHEREAS, Public construction in this Commonwealth accounts for nearly \$36 billion annually in State spending; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Public construction includes a wide range of
- 7 projects, including renovations to State government buildings
- 8 and local school buildings; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Public construction constitutes a significant share
- 10 of economic activity in this Commonwealth and is a major
- 11 economic driver and job creator; and
- 12 WHEREAS, For more than 100 years, there have been no
- 13 substantive changes to this Commonwealth's public construction
- 14 laws; and
- 15 WHEREAS, During that period, as with every other industry in
- 16 the United States, major changes have occurred with technology,
- 17 management techniques and practices, materials and the need for
- 18 greater energy efficiency in the design and construction

- 1 industry; and
- 2 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth, the design community, contractors,
- 3 trades people and laborers would benefit from a thorough review
- 4 and possible recommendations for stakeholders to consider
- 5 potential changes to this Commonwealth's public construction
- 6 laws; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The key principles of any changes to this
- 8 Commonwealth's public construction laws shall include
- 9 transparency, flexibility, accountability and efficiency;
- 10 therefore be it
- 11 RESOLVED, That the Senate direct the Joint State Government
- 12 Commission to establish a task force to compare public and
- 13 private construction projects to identify ways to improve public
- 14 construction projects; and be it further
- 15 RESOLVED, That the task force be appointed by the President
- 16 pro tempore of the Senate, in consultation with the Majority
- 17 Leader and Minority Leader of the Senate, and the Speaker of the
- 18 House of the Representatives, in consultation with the Majority
- 19 Leader and Minority Leader of the House of Representatives, and
- 20 shall be comprised of two members of the Senate, two members of
- 21 the House of Representatives, two representatives of contractors
- 22 with one representing merit shops and one representing union
- 23 contractors (both contractors should have the ability to work
- 24 both as a contractor and as a construction manager with bonding
- 25 and insurance capabilities), two representatives of trade
- 26 unions, two merit shop contractors with more than 150 full-time
- 27 employees, two attorneys who dedicate the majority of their
- 28 practice time to construction law, two design industry
- 29 representatives, three representatives of public agencies or
- 30 public sector owners specializing in the procurement process

- 1 (one representative from the Pennsylvania Department of General
- 2 Services, one representative from the Pennsylvania Department of
- 3 Education and one representative from the Pennsylvania
- 4 Department of Transportation) and two private sector owners who
- 5 have built over \$50 million in fully private construction
- 6 projects within the past three years; and be it further
- 7 RESOLVED, That the task force review and analyze 20
- 8 Pennsylvania construction projects, ten privately bid and
- 9 awarded, five bid and awarded by the Department of General
- 10 Services and five bid and awarded by school districts, to
- 11 compare the estimated original costs, bid costs, actual costs,
- 12 number and amount of change orders and estimated completion
- 13 dates and actual completion dates; and be it further
- 14 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission submit a
- 15 report of the study to the Senate no later than December 31,
- 16 2014.
