AN ACT

Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the 1 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in juries and jurors, 2 further providing for exemptions from jury duty and for list 3 of disqualified jurors. 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 6 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 4503(a) of Title 42 of the Pennsylvania 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding paragraphs to read: § 4503. Exemptions from jury duty. 10 General rule. -- No person shall be exempt or excused from 11 jury duty except the following: 12 (6) Persons 75 years of age or older who opt not to 13 14 serve. 15 (7) Breastfeeding women providing the court with a 16 certified letter from their physician which states that the woman is breastfeeding. An excuse under this paragraph shall 17 18 be valid for one year and may be renewed for one additional

- 1 year provided that the woman is able to provide the court
- with a certified letter from the woman's physician which
- 3 states that the woman is breastfeeding.

- 9 <u>(c) Persons aged 75 years or older.--A person who is exempt</u>
- 10 or excused from jury duty under section 4503(a)(6) (relating to
- 11 <u>exemptions from jury duty</u>) may petition the jury selection
- 12 commission to have the person's name placed on the list of
- 13 <u>disqualified jurors. A person placed on the list may, at any</u>
- 14 time, petition for removal of the person's name from the list
- 15 unless the person is disqualified under section 4502 (relating
- 16 to qualifications of jurors).
- 17 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
