1 2 4 5 6 7 8	Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions; in rules of the road in general, providing for solid waste collection vehicles; in miscellaneous provisions, further providing for the offense of homicide by vehicle and for the offense of aggravated assault by vehicle; and, in lighting equipment, further providing for use and display of illuminated signs.

8	(2) Within 48 hours after the violation occurs, the
9	solid waste collection worker shall deliver a copy of the
10	report to a police officer having authority to exercise
11	police power in the area where the violation occurred subject
12	to the following:
13	(i) If the police officer believes that the report
14	established a sufficient basis for the issuance of a
15	citation, the officer shall file a citation and a copy of
16	the report with the issuing authority.
17	(ii) If the issuing authority determines that the
18	report and citation establish a sufficient basis for the
19	issuance of a summons, a summons shall be issued in
20	accordance with general rules governing the institution
21	of proceedings in summary traffic offense cases.
