1 2 3 4 5	Amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for incentives for municipal volunteers of fire companies and emergency medical services agencies and volunteers of hazardous materials response teams.
6	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
7	hereby enacts as follows:
8	Section 1. Title 35 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
9	Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

1	SUBCHAPTER A
2	PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS
3	<u>Sec.</u>
4	7901-A. Scope of chapter.
5	<u>7902-A. Purpose.</u>
6	<u>7903-A. Definitions.</u>
7	<u>§ 7901-A. Scope of chapter.</u>
8	This chapter relates to incentives for municipal volunteers
9	of fire companies and emergency medical services agencies and
10	volunteers of hazardous materials response teams.
11	<u>§ 7902-A. Purpose.</u>
12	The purpose of this chapter is to authorize municipalities to
13	enact a tax credit against an active volunteer's earned income
14	and property tax liability as a financial incentive to:
15	(1) Indicate the municipality's acknowledgment of the
16	value of and the absence of any public cost for volunteer
17	fire protection, emergency medical services and hazardous
18	materials response provided by active volunteers.
19	(2) Encourage other individuals to newly volunteer or
20	for former volunteers to consider rejoining as active
21	volunteers in a volunteer fire company, emergency medical
22	services agency or hazardous materials response team.
23	<u>§ 7903-A. Definitions.</u>
24	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
25	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
26	context clearly indicates otherwise:
27	"Active volunteer." A volunteer for a volunteer fire company
28	or emergency medical services agency who has complied with the
29	requirements of the volunteer service credit program and who is
30	certified under section 7923-A (relating to certification). The
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1	term includes a person who is a volunteer member of a hazardous
2	<u>materials response team.</u>
3	"Commissioner." The State Fire Commissioner of the
4	Commonwealth.
5	"Earned income tax." A tax on earned income and net profits
6	levied under Chapter 3 of the act of December 31, 1965
7	(P.L.1257, No.511), known as The Local Tax Enabling Act.
8	"Emergency medical services agency." As defined in section
9	8103 (relating to definitions).
10	"Governing body." A county council, county board of
11	commissioners, city council, borough council, incorporated town
12	council, board of township commissioners, board of township
13	supervisors, governing council of a home rule municipality or
14	optional plan municipality, a school district board of directors
15	or a governing council of any similar purpose government which
16	may be created by statute after the effective date of this
17	section and which has adopted a tax credit under this chapter.
18	"Local Tax Enabling Act." The act of December 31, 1965
19	(P.L.1257, No.511), known as The Local Tax Enabling Act.
20	"Municipality." A city, borough, incorporated town or
21	township located in this Commonwealth.
22	"Tax credit." The tax credit granted under section 7911-A
23	(relating to program authorization) or 7912.1-A (relating to
24	real property tax credit).
25	"Volunteer." A member of a volunteer fire company or an
26	emergency medical services agency or a member of a hazardous
27	<u>materials response team.</u>
28	"Volunteer fire company." A nonprofit chartered corporation,
29	association or organization located in this Commonwealth that
30	provides fire protection services and may offer other voluntary
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1	emergency services within this Commonwealth.
2	"Volunteer service credit program." The program established
3	<u>under section 7921-A (relating to volunteer service credit</u>
4	program) to determine the active status of a volunteer.
5	SUBCHAPTER B
6	TAX CREDITS
7	<u>Sec.</u>
8	7911-A. Program authorization.
9	<u>7912-A. Claim.</u>
10	7912.1-A. Real property tax credit.
11	7913-A. Limitations.
12	<u>§ 7911-A. Program authorization.</u>
13	(a) EstablishmentA municipality or school district that
14	levies an earned income tax may establish by ordinance or
15	resolution a tax credit against an individual's liability
16	imposed under Chapter 3 of the act of December 31, 1965
17	(P.L.1257, No.511), known as The Local Tax Enabling Act, for
18	<u>active service as a volunteer.</u>
19	(b) AmountA municipality or school district must set
20	forth in the ordinance or resolution the amount of the tax
21	credit. If the total earned income tax liability is less than
22	the amount established, the tax credit shall equal the remaining
23	tax liability.
24	(c) Public noticeAt least 30 days prior to adoption of
25	the ordinance or resolution, the governing body shall give
26	public notice of its intent to adopt an ordinance or resolution
27	to establish a tax credit and conduct at least one public
28	hearing on the issue.
29	(d) Specific noticeA municipality or school district that
30	establishes a tax credit under this chapter shall notify the

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1	commissioner in the manner and pursuant to any schedule
2	prescribed by the commissioner.
3	<u>§ 7912-A. Claim.</u>
4	(a) EligibilityAn individual who satisfies all of the
5	following criteria may claim a tax credit established under
6	section 7911-A (relating to program authorization):
7	(1) The individual is subject to an earned income tax
8	that has established a tax credit under section 7911-A.
9	(2) The individual is certified under section 7923-A
10	(relating to certification).
11	(b) ReturnAn active volunteer may claim a tax credit
12	provided for under this subchapter when filing a joint return.
13	The tax return form shall provide a mechanism for separating the
14	liability of an individual for any earned income tax imposed by
15	the school district of residence from the liability of an
16	individual for any earned income tax imposed by the
17	municipality.
18	§ 7912.1-A. Real property tax credit.
19	(a) School districtThe governing body of a school
20	district may provide, by resolution, for a tax credit against
21	real property tax to be granted to an active volunteer. The tax
22	credit shall apply to tax levied on residential real property
23	owned and occupied by an active volunteer who is certified under
24	section 7923-A (relating to certification). The amount of the
25	tax credit shall be equivalent to no more than 20% of the tax
26	liability of the active volunteer.
27	(b) CountyThe governing body of a county may provide, by
28	resolution, for a tax credit against real property taxes to be
29	granted to active volunteer firefighters. The tax credit shall
30	apply to taxes levied on residential real property owned and
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1	occupied by an active volunteer firefighter who is certified
2	under section 7923-A. The amount of the tax credit shall be
3	equivalent to no more than 20% of the tax liability of the
4	active volunteer firefighter.
5	<u>§ 7913-A. Limitations.</u>
6	<u>A tax credit established under this subchapter may be used</u>
7	against the active volunteer's earned income tax or property tax
8	liability for the current taxable year.
9	SUBCHAPTER C
10	VOLUNTEER SERVICE CREDIT
11	<u>Sec.</u>
12	<u>7921-A. Volunteer service credit program.</u>
13	7922-A. Service record.
14	7923-A. Certification.
15	7924-A. Rejection and appeal.
16	<u>§ 7921-A. Volunteer service credit program.</u>
17	(a) EstablishmentWithin 90 days of the effective date of
18	this section, the commissioner shall establish a volunteer
19	service credit program that establishes the annual requirements
20	for the certification of a volunteer in active service at a
21	volunteer fire company, an emergency medical services agency or
22	<u>hazardous materials response team.</u>
23	(b) ActivitiesThe volunteer service credit program shall
24	consider the following activities in determining credit toward a
25	certification of active service:
26	(1) The number of emergency calls to which a volunteer
27	responds.
28	(2) The level of training and participation in formal
29	training and drills for a volunteer.
30	(3) The total amount of time expended by a volunteer on

1	administrative and other support services, including
2	fundraising and facility or equipment maintenance.
3	(4) The involvement in other events or projects that aid
4	the financial viability, emergency response or operational
5	readiness of a volunteer fire company, an emergency medical
6	services agency or hazardous materials response team.
7	(c) GuidelinesThe commissioner shall adopt guidelines,
8	including forms and applications, necessary to implement this
9	section.
10	<u>§ 7922-A. Service record.</u>
11	(a) LogThe chief of a volunteer fire company or the
12	supervisor, chief of an emergency medical services agency or
13	supervisor or chief of a hazardous materials response team or
14	their designees shall establish and maintain a service log that
15	documents the activities of each volunteer that qualifies for
16	credit toward active service under the volunteer service credit
17	program and the calculation of the total credits earned for each
18	volunteer in the volunteer fire company, emergency medical
19	services agency or hazardous materials response team.
20	(b) ReviewService logs established and maintained by
21	volunteer fire companies, emergency medical services agencies or
22	hazardous materials response teams shall be subject to periodic
23	review by the Auditor General, the governing body where the
24	volunteer fire company, emergency medical services agency or
25	hazardous materials response team is located and the governing
26	body where the volunteer fire company, emergency medical
27	services agency or hazardous materials response team provides
28	services.
29	<u>§ 7923-A. Certification.</u>
30	(a) Self-certificationThe active volunteer shall sign and
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1	submit an application to the chief of the volunteer fire
2	company, the supervisor or chief of the emergency medical
3	services agency or the supervisor or chief of the hazardous
4	materials response team where the volunteer serves.
5	(b) Local sign-offThe chief and another officer of the
6	volunteer fire company, the supervisor or chief and another
7	officer of the emergency medical services agency or the
8	supervisor or chief and another officer of the hazardous
9	materials response team shall sign the application attesting to
10	the individual's status as an active volunteer. The application
11	shall then be forwarded to the county, municipality or school
12	district, as appropriate, for final review and processing.
13	<u>§ 7924-A. Rejection and appeal.</u>
14	(a) General ruleA governing body that establishes a tax
15	credit under this chapter shall adopt, by ordinance or
16	resolution, a process for rejecting a claim by an active
17	volunteer who does not satisfy all of the criteria established
18	under this chapter for each type of tax credit provided under
19	this chapter.
20	(b) AppealAn active volunteer shall have the right to
21	appeal a claim that has been rejected by a governing body. The
22	governing body shall establish, by ordinance or resolution, the
23	procedure by which a rejected claim can be appealed.

25	MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

27	7931-A. Penalties for false reporting.
28	<u>§ 7931-A. Penalties for false reporting.</u>
29	The following shall apply:
30	(1) Any person who knowingly makes or conspires to make

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1 <u>a false service record report under this chapter to the</u>

2 <u>commissioner commits a misdemeanor of the first degree</u>

- 3 punishable by a fine of \$2,500.
- 4 (2) Any person who knowingly provides or conspires to
- 5 provide false information that is used to compile a service
- 6 record report under this chapter commits a misdemeanor of the
- 7 <u>first degree punishable by a fine of \$2,500.</u>
- 8 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
