## AN ACT

Amending the act of July 2, 1993 (P.L.345, No.48), entitled "An 1 act empowering the General Counsel or his designee to issue 2 subpoenas for certain licensing board activities; providing 3 for hearing examiners in the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs; providing additional powers to the 5 Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs; and 6 further providing for civil penalties and license 7 suspension," further providing for hearing examiners. 8 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 hereby enacts as follows: 11 Section 1. Section 3 of the act of July 2, 1993 (P.L.345, 12 No.48), entitled "An act empowering the General Counsel or his 13 designee to issue subpoenas for certain licensing board activities; providing for hearing examiners in the Bureau of 14 Professional and Occupational Affairs; providing additional 15 powers to the Commissioner of Professional and Occupational 16 Affairs; and further providing for civil penalties and license 17 18 suspension," is amended by adding a subsection to read: 19 Section 3. Hearing examiners. 20

- 1 (e) Reporting of offenses. -- Each holder of a license,
- 2 registration, certificate or permit from a licensing board or
- 3 <u>commission shall report to the issuing licensing board or</u>
- 4 commission, in writing, within 30 days, if the individual has
- 5 been convicted, found guilty or pleaded nolo contendere, or
- 6 received probation without verdict or received accelerated
- 7 <u>rehabilitative disposition as to any felony or misdemeanor or</u>
- 8 any drug violation. A criminal matter that has been expunged by
- 9 order of a court is not required to be reported.
- 10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
