## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5	Amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in municipal police education and training, further providing for definitions, for police training, for automatic certification and for reimbursement of expenses.
6	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
7	hereby enacts as follows:
8	Section 1. The definitions of "police department" and
9	"police officer" in section 2162 of Title 53 of the Pennsylvania
10	Consolidated Statutes, amended March 14, 2014 (P.L.38, No.18),
11	are amended and the section is amended by adding definitions to

13	§ 2162. Definitions.
14	The following words and phrases when used in this subchapter
15	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
16	context clearly indicates otherwise:
17	* * *
18	"Police department." Any of the following:
19	(1) A public agency of a political subdivision having

1 general police powers and charged with making arrests in connection with the enforcement of the criminal or traffic 2 3 laws. This paragraph includes the sheriff's office in a county of the second class. 4

5 A campus police or university police department, as (2) used in section 2416 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, 6 7 No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, certified 8 by the Office of Attorney General as a criminal justice 9 agency under the definition of "criminal justice agency" in 10 18 Pa.C.S. § 9102 (relating to definitions). This paragraph does not include a campus police or university police 11 12 department of the State System of Higher Education and its member institutions. 13

14 A railroad or street railway police department (3) 15 formed with officers commissioned under 22 Pa.C.S. Ch. 33 16 (relating to railroad and street railway police) or any prior 17 statute providing for such commissioning.

(4) The Capitol Police.

(5) The Harrisburg International Airport Police.

An airport authority police department. (6)

21 A county park police force under section 2511(b) of (7) 22 the act of August 9, 1955 (P.L.323, No.130), known as The 23 County Code.

(8) A school police department.

25 "Police officer." Any of the following:

26 A full-time or part-time employee assigned to (1)27 criminal or traffic law enforcement duties of any of the 28 following:

29 A police department of a county, city, borough, (i) 30 town or township.

9	(e) School police officersAny school police officer who,	
10	as of the effective date of this subsection, has successfully	
11	completed a basic training course similar to that required under	
12	this subchapter shall, after review by the commission, be	
13	certified as having met the basic training requirements of this	
14	subchapter. Any school police officer who, as of the effective	
15	date of this subsection, has not successfully completed a basic	
16	training course similar to that required under this subchapter	
17	which qualifies the police officer for certification shall be	
18	able to perform the duties of a school police officer until	
19	certified by the commission, but no longer than two years from	
20	the effective date of this subsection.

23	§ 2170. Reimbursement of expenses.	
24	(a) General ruleThe commission shall provide for	
25	reimbursement to each municipality and school district of the	
26	entire amount of the allowable tuition and the ordinary and	
27	necessary living and travel expenses incurred by their police	
28	officers while attending certified municipal police basic	
29	training schools if the municipality [adheres] and school	
30	district adhere to the training standards established by the

1 commission. The regular salary of police officers while 2 attending approved schools shall be paid by the employing 3 municipality or school district, as applicable. The commission shall reimburse the employing municipality or school district 4 for 60% of the regular salaries of police officers while 5 attending schools approved under this subchapter. The commission 6 shall require written documentation of all expenses incurred by 7 8 municipalities or school districts relating to the training of [municipal] police officers for the purposes of reimbursement by 9 10 the commission. All municipalities and school districts shall 11 annually audit these funds as part of their annual audit and 12 submit a copy of the audit to the commission. Failure to perform 13 the audit and submit a copy of it to the commission shall render 14 the municipality or school district in violation of this 15 subchapter.

17 (c) Application for funding. -- All municipalities and school 18 <u>districts</u> of this Commonwealth or groups of municipalities <u>and</u> 19 school districts acting in concert may make application to the 20 commission for funding pursuant to the provisions of this 21 subchapter. The application shall be accompanied by a certified copy of a resolution adopted by its governing body. The 22 23 resolution shall provide that, while receiving any State funds 24 pursuant to this subchapter, the municipality or school district 25 agrees to adhere to the standards for training established by 26 the commission. The application shall contain any information 27 that the commission requests.

(d) Subsequent employment with another municipality <u>or</u>
<u>school district</u>.--If a police officer, within two years
following certification, terminates his employment with the

1 municipality or school district by which the officer was employed at the time he was certified as having met the 2 commission's requirement and subsequently obtains employment as 3 a police officer with another municipality or school district, 4 the municipality or school district which employs the previously 5 certified police officer shall reimburse the municipality or 6 <u>school district</u> which formerly employed the police officer for 7 the nonreimbursable portion of the salary paid to the police 8 9 officer while complying with the provisions of this subchapter. \* \* \* 10

11 Section 4. This act shall take effect in one year.
