AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in reimbursements by Commonwealth and between school districts, further providing for State reimbursement for health services.
8	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
9	hereby enacts as follows:
10	Section 1. Section 2505.1(a) of the act of March 10, 1949
11	(P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949,
12	amended July 13, 1979 (P.L.94, No.41), is amended to read:
13	Section 2505.1. State Reimbursement for Health Services
14	(a) Every school district and joint school board which renders
15	health services to children of school age shall be reimbursed by
16	the Commonwealth on account of health services which conform to
17	standards approved by the Secretary of Health. Reimbursements
18	shall be paid by the Secretary of Health. The amount thereof

shall be the actual cost of the medical and dental services and 1 2 school nurse services as certified to the Secretary of Health, 3 less any charges deemed unreasonable by him, but for medical services shall not for any school year exceed the sum of (1) one 4 dollar and sixty cents (\$1.60) multiplied by the number of 5 children enrolled in a school for the entire school term of that 6 school year and for whom the school district or joint school 7 8 board maintains comprehensive health records as defined in 9 section 1402, and (2) a proportionate part of one dollar and 10 sixty cents (\$1.60) for each child enrolled for a part of the school term of that school year and for whom the school district 11 or joint school board maintains a comprehensive health record as 12 defined in section 1402, for dental services shall not for any 13 school year exceed the sum of (1) eighty cents (\$.80) multiplied 14 by the number of children enrolled in a school for the entire 15 16 school term of that school year and for whom the school district or joint school board maintains comprehensive health records as 17 18 defined in section 1402, and (2) a proportionate part of eighty cents (\$.80) for each child enrolled for a part of the school 19 20 term of that school year and for whom the school district or joint school board maintains a comprehensive health record as 21 defined in section 1402, and for school nurse services shall not 22 23 for any school year exceed the sum of (1) [seven dollars 24 (\$7.00)] twelve dollars (\$12.00) multiplied by the number of 25 children enrolled in a school for the entire school term of that 26 school year, and (2) a proportionate part of [seven dollars (\$7.00)] twelve dollars (\$12.00) for each child enrolled for a 27 28 part of the school term of that school year.

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30 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
