## AN ACT

Amending the act of July 9, 1987 (P.L.220, No.39), entitled "An 1 act licensing and regulating the practice of social work; 2 providing penalties; and making an appropriation," further 3 providing for State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists and Professional Counselors, for 5 restriction on the use of title "Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist" and for penalties. 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. Sections 5(a) and 16.2 of the act of July 9, 1987 11 (P.L.220, No.39), known as the Social Workers, Marriage and 12 Family Therapists and Professional Counselors Act, amended or 13 added December 21, 1998 (P.L.1017, No.136), are amended to read: 14 Section 5. State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and Family 15 Therapists and Professional Counselors. 16 Creation. -- There is hereby created the State Board of 17 Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists and Professional 18 Counselors, a departmental administrative board in the Department of State. The board shall consist of 13 members who 19 are citizens of the United States and who have been residents of 20

- 1 this Commonwealth for a two-year period, two of whom shall be
- 2 public members; five of whom shall be licensed social workers,
- 3 at least one of whom shall be a licensed clinical social worker
- 4 and at least one of whom shall be a licensed social worker; two
- 5 of whom shall be licensed marriage and family therapists; two of
- 6 whom shall be licensed professional counselors; one of whom
- 7 shall be either a licensed marriage and family therapist or a
- 8 licensed professional counselor [as hereafter provided] whose
- 9 membership shall rotate at the expiration of the member's second
- 10 term; and one of whom shall be the Commissioner of Professional
- 11 and Occupational Affairs.

- 13 Section 16.2. Restriction on the use of [title "Licensed
- 14 Marriage and Family Therapist."] certain titles.
- Only individuals who have received licenses as [licensed]
- 16 marriage and family therapists under this act may style
- 17 themselves as licensed marriage and family therapists, marriage
- 18 and family therapists, family therapists, marriage therapists or
- 19 <u>couples therapists</u> and use the letters "L.M.F.T." <u>or "M.F.T."</u> in
- 20 connection with their names. It shall be unlawful for an
- 21 individual to style oneself as a licensed marriage and family
- 22 therapist, marriage and family therapist, family therapist,
- 23 <u>marriage therapist or couples therapist</u> or use any words or
- 24 symbols indicating or tending to indicate that the individual is
- 25 a licensed marriage and family therapist, marriage and family
- 26 therapist, family therapist, marriage therapist or couples
- 27 <u>therapist</u> without holding a license <u>as a marriage and family</u>
- 28 <u>therapist</u> in good standing under this act. <u>This section shall</u>
- 29 not apply to the following:
- 30 (1) A person employed by the Commonwealth in a marriage

- and family therapist position before the effective date of
- 2 <u>this paragraph.</u>
- 3 (2) A person employed as a school marriage and family
- 4 <u>therapist in a public or private school in this Commonwealth</u>
- 5 <u>before the effective date of this paragraph.</u>
- 6 (3) A person who holds a valid license or is certified
- 7 <u>or regulated in accordance with another professional</u>
- 8 <u>licensure law or State certification of the Commonwealth and</u>
- 9 who is credentialed by the American Association of Marriage
- and Family Therapists as a Clinical Fellow.
- 11 (4) A person who is working to meet the supervised
- 12 <u>experience requirement to become a licensed marriage and</u>
- family therapist and whose duties are supervised by a
- 14 <u>licensed marriage and family therapist or other licensed</u>
- mental health professional if the person does not represent
- himself or herself as a licensed marriage and family
- 17 therapist.
- 18 (5) A student of marriage and family therapy who is
- 19 enrolled in a prescribed course of study at an accredited
- 20 educational institution if the person does not represent
- 21 himself or herself as a licensed marriage and family
- 22 therapist.
- 23 Section 2. Section 17(b) of the act, amended October 22,
- 24 2014 (P.L.2884, No.179), is amended to read:
- 25 Section 17. Penalties.
- 26 \* \* \*
- 27 (b) Civil penalty. -- In addition to any other civil remedy or
- 28 criminal penalty provided for in this act, the board, by a vote
- 29 of the majority of the maximum number of the authorized
- 30 membership of the board as provided by law, or by a vote of the

- 1 majority of the duly qualified and confirmed membership or a
- 2 minimum of three members, whichever is greater, may levy a civil
- 3 penalty of up to [\$1,000] \$10,000 on any current licensee who
- 4 violates any provision of this act or on any person who holds
- 5 himself or herself out as a licensed bachelor social worker,
- 6 licensed social worker, licensed clinical social worker,
- 7 licensed marriage and family therapist or licensed professional
- 8 counselor without being so licensed pursuant to this act. The
- 9 board shall levy this penalty only after affording the accused
- 10 party the opportunity for a hearing, as provided in Title 2 of
- 11 the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes (relating to
- 12 administrative law and procedure).

- 14 Section 3. The State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and
- 15 Family Therapists and Professional Counselors shall promulgate
- 16 regulations to carry out this act. The State Board of Social
- 17 Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists and Professional
- 18 Counselors shall publish the regulations in the Pennsylvania
- 19 Bulletin within 18 months of the effective date of this section.
- 20 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 120 days.
