5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Title 35 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
8	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:

10	<u>(a) Written request</u>
11	(1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, upon
12	receiving a written request from a public safety official, a
13	<u>political subdivision or a Commonwealth agency may not</u>
14	disclose the home address, personal telephone number or e-
15	<u>mail address of the public safety official or his or her</u>
16	spouse, child or parent.
17	(2) A written request under paragraph (1) must be signed

18 by the public safety official and must include the name and

1	address of the public safety official and the name of any
2	spouse, child or parent for whom confidentiality is
3	requested.
4	(b) Penalty.
5	(1) Except as provided under paragraph (2), a person who
6	knowingly discloses information protected from disclosure
7	under subsection (a) commits a summary offense.
8	(2) A person who commits a second or subsequent
9	violation of this section, or a first offense if the person
10	knowingly and willfully causes substantial harm or undue
11	influence or intimidation, constitutes a misdemeanor of the
12	third degree.
13	(c) Rules and regulations. The Attorney General shall
14	promulgate rules and regulations necessary to carry out this
15	section.

4	(1) A VIOLATION OF SUBSECTION (A) IS A MISDEMEANOR OF

6	SAFETY OFFICIAL OR HIS SPOUSE OR CHILD.
7	(2) A VIOLATION OF SUBSECTION (A) THAT LEADS TO THE
8	BODILY INJURY OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICIAL OR HIS SPOUSE OR
9	CHILD IS A MISDEMEANOR OF THE FIRST DEGREE.
10	(C) RIGHT TO ACTION
11	(1) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER LAW, A PUBLIC SAFETY
12	OFFICIAL WHOSE HOME ADDRESS OR TELEPHONE NUMBER IS SOLICITED,
13	SOLD OR TRADED IN VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION MAY BRING AN
14	ACTION IN A COURT OF COMPETENT JURISDICTION.
15	(2) IF A JURY OR COURT FINDS THAT A VIOLATION HAS
16	OCCURRED, DAMAGES SHALL BE AWARDED TO THE PUBLIC SAFETY
17	OFFICIAL IN AN AMOUNT UP TO A MAXIMUM OF THREE TIMES THE
18	ACTUAL DAMAGES, BUT IN NO CASE LESS THAN TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS

20	(d) DefinitionsThe following words and phrases when used
21	in this section shall have the meanings given to them in this
22	subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
23	"Commonwealth agency." As defined in 71 Pa.C.S. § 4102
24	(relating to definitions).
25	"Public safety official." An individual referred to in 18
26	Pa.C.S. § 2702(c) (relating to aggravated assault), except
27	paragraphs (22), (26), (27), (28), (29), (30), (31), (32), (33)_ <-
28	and (36). The term includes any person who is determined to be a
29	law enforcement officer for purposes of the act of February 14,
30	2008 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the Right-to-Know Law. THE TERM <-
