## AN ACT

Designating a bridge on that portion of Garrett Road over the Darby Creek, Upper Darby Township, Delaware County, as the 2 Honorable Nicholas A. Micozzie Bridge; designating the section of Pennsylvania Route 849 in Newport, Perry County, as the United States Navy Petty Officer 1st Class A. Louis De 5 Lancey Memorial Highway; designating the Department of 6 Conservation and Natural Resources' Resource Management 7 Center, located in Conyngham Township, Columbia County, asthe Edward W. Helfrick Resource Management Center; 9 designating the 700 to 800 block of U.S. Route 13, also known 10 as the Chester Pike, in Prospect Park Borough, Delaware 11 County, as the Officers Luke Arlington Conner and J. Horace 12 13 Callaghan Memorial Highway; and making a related repeal. 14 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 15 hereby enacts as follows: 16 Section 1. Honorable Nicholas A. Micozzie Bridge. 17 Findings. -- The General Assembly finds and declares as 18 follows:

Born in Philadelphia, Nicholas A. Micozzie graduated

- degree in business administration from St. Joseph's College.
- 2 (2) Nicholas Micozzie served in the United States Air
- 3 Force from 1950 through 1954, reaching the rank of Staff
- 4 Sergeant.
- 5 (3) Nicholas Micozzie devoted 44 years to serving in
- 6 public office. In 1970, Nicholas Micozzie was elected as an
- 7 Upper Darby councilman and served 19 years in that role.
- 8 (4) In 1978, Nicholas Micozzie was elected as the State
- 9 Representative for the 163rd Legislative District. During his
- 10 36 years in the House of Representatives, Micozzie held
- 11 several leadership positions, including chairman of the
- 12 Transportation Committee of the House of Representatives and
- chairman of the Insurance Committee of the House of
- 14 Representatives.
- 15 (b) Designation. -- The bridge located on Garrett Road, Upper
- 16 Darby Township, Delaware County, over the Darby Creek is hereby
- 17 designated the Honorable Nicholas A. Micozzie Bridge.
- 18 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
- 19 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
- 20 traffic in both directions on the bridge.
- 21 Section 2. United States Navy Petty Officer 1st Class A. Louis
- De Lancey Memorial Highway.
- 23 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
- 24 follows:
- 25 (1) A. Louis "Lou" De Lancey was born March 8, 1936, in
- Newport to Sherman and Dorothy Adams De Lancey.
- 27 (2) In June 1954, De Lancey joined the Navy and served
- aboard the USS Midway and the USS Hanson during the Korean
- War era.
- 30 (3) While aboard the USS Midway, Petty Officer De Lancey

- assisted in the evacuation of more than 18,000 civilians and
- 2 15,000 of Chiang Kai-shek's Nationalist troops to Formosa,
- now known as Taiwan, as they fled from the Communist People's
- 4 Liberation Army advancing on the Dachen (Tachen) Islands.
- 5 (4) In recognition of his service, Petty Officer De
- 6 Lancey received the China Service Medal, the Good Conduct
- 7 Medal and the National Defense Service Medal.
- 8 (5) Petty Officer De Lancey was a lifelong member and
- 9 Post Commander of William H. Saylor VFW #34, Newport American
- 10 Legion Post #177, Commander of the Perry Council VFW,
- 11 cofounder and President of the Perry County Sailors
- 12 Association, a member of the USS Midway Veterans Association,
- 13 a member of the Navy Club of the USA and was inducted to the
- 14 Chapel of the Four Chaplains Legion of Honor in 2003 for his
- work with the Korean War Veterans Recognition Ceremony.
- 16 (6) In addition to his military service, Petty Officer
- 17 De Lancey was a member of the Loyal Order of Moose Lodge #925
- and the Plumbers and Pipefitters Local Union #520.
- 19 (7) After a courageous battle with cancer, Petty Officer
- De Lancey passed away on February 23, 2014, at 77 years of
- 21 age.
- 22 (b) Designation. -- The section of Pennsylvania Route 849 in
- 23 Newport, Perry County, is hereby designated as the United States
- 24 Navy Petty Officer 1st Class A. Louis De Lancey Memorial
- 25 Highway.
- 26 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
- 27 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the highway to
- 28 traffic in both directions on the highway.
- 29 Section 3. Edward W. Helfrick Resource Management Center.
- 30 (a) Declaration of policy. The General Assembly finds and

- 2 (1) Edward W. Helfrick served as Senator from the 27th
- 3 Senatorial District from 1981 to 2003.
- 4 (2) The Roaring Creek Tract of the Weiser State Forest
  5 in Northumberland and Columbia Counties was established in
  6 2003.
- 7 (3) Senator Helfrick was widely known as an outdoors
  8 enthusiast, taking part in and promoting outdoor recreational
  9 opportunities.
- (4) Senator Helfrick was instrumental in the transfer of
  land from a private company to the Commonwealth to establish
  the Roaring Creek Tract of the Weiser State Forest to provide
  additional outdoor recreational opportunities and to preserve
  the land in an undeveloped state.
- 15 <del>(b) Designation.--</del>
- 16 (1) The Resource Management Center located in the Weiser

  State Forest in Conyngham Township, Columbia County, is

  designated and shall be referred to as the Edward W. Helfrick

  Resource Management Center.
- 20 (2) The Department of General Services shall erect and
  21 the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources shall
  22 maintain appropriate signage to indicate the designation
  23 under paragraph (1).
- 24 Section 4 3. Officers Luke Arlington Conner and J. Horace <-25 Callaghan Memorial Highway.
- 26 (a) Findings.--
- 27 (1) Officer Luke Arlington Conner.
- 28 (i) Officer Conner was a resident of Prospect Park
  29 and an officer of the Prospect Park Police Department for
  30 two years.

- 1 (ii) On October 8, 1919, Officer Conner was on foot
- patrol on U.S. Route 13, also known as the Chester Pike,
- and was struck by a vehicle, dying six hours later in a
- 4 local hospital.
- 5 (iii) Officer Conner was survived by his wife and
- five children.
- 7 (2) Officer J. Horace Callaghan.
- 8 (i) Officer Callaghan was a resident of Prospect
- 9 Park and an officer of the Prospect Park Police
- 10 Department for 15 years.
- 11 (ii) On December 21, 1940, Officer Callaghan was
- directing traffic on U.S. Route 13, also known as the
- 13 Chester Pike, near Stewart Avenue, when he was struck by
- 14 a drunk driver.
- 15 (iii) Officer Callaghan was survived by his wife and
- three children.
- 17 (b) Designation. -- The 700 to 800 block of U.S. Route 13,
- 18 also known as the Chester Pike, in Prospect Park Borough,
- 19 Delaware County, is designated as the Officers Luke Arlington
- 20 Conner and J. Horace Callaghan Memorial Highway.
- 21 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
- 22 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the highway to
- 23 traffic in both directions on the highway.
- 24 Section 5 4. Repeals.
- 25 The act of June 26, 2014 (P.L.790, No.77), entitled "An act
- 26 designating the 700 to 800 block of U.S. Route 13, also known as
- 27 the Chester Pike, in Prospect Park Borough, Delaware County, as
- 28 the Officers Luke Arlington Conner and John Horace Callaghan
- 29 Memorial Highway," is repealed.
