AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain
- provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- laws relating thereto," in charter schools, further providing
- for enrollment.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. Section 1723-A heading, (a) and (b) of the act of
- 10 March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code
- 11 of 1949, amended June 26, 1999 (P.L.394, No.36), are amended to
- 12 read:
- 13 Section 1723-A. Application for Admission and Enrollment.--
- 14 (a) (1) All resident children in this Commonwealth qualify for
- 15 admission to a charter school within the provisions of
- 16 subsection (b). If more students apply to the charter school
- 17 than the number of attendance slots available in the school,
- 18 then students must be selected on a random basis from a pool of
- 19 [qualified applicants meeting the established eligibility
- 20 criteria and submitting an application] resident children who

- 1 have submitted an application in accordance with subsection (a)
- 2 (3) and (4) by the deadline established by the charter school,
- 3 except that the charter school may give preference in enrollment
- 4 to a child of a parent who has actively participated in the
- 5 development of the charter school and to siblings of students
- 6 presently enrolled in the charter school. First preference shall
- 7 be given to students who reside in the district or districts.
- 8 (2) Resident children not selected from the initial pool
- 9 <u>shall be placed on a waiting list in random order. Resident</u>
- 10 children who apply after a waiting list has been created shall
- 11 be placed on the waiting list in the order in which their
- 12 applications are received. The charter school shall enroll
- 13 <u>additional resident children from the waiting list when space</u>
- 14 <u>becomes available.</u>
- 15 (3) Applications for admission to a charter school shall be
- 16 made on a form developed by the department. The application form
- 17 developed by the department shall be made available at the
- 18 charter school and posted on the charter school's publicly
- 19 <u>accessible Internet website</u>, if the charter school has a
- 20 publicly accessible Internet website.
- 21 (4) Applications for admission to a charter school or
- 22 entrance into a pool for random selection shall not require or
- 23 <u>include a request for any other information beyond the contents</u>
- 24 of the application form developed by the department unless
- 25 <u>delineated in the school's charter, permitted under subsection</u>
- 26 (b)(2) or (2.1) and approved by the local board of school
- 27 <u>directors</u>, in the case of a charter school or regional charter
- 28 school, or by the department, in the case of a cyber charter
- 29 school.
- 30 (5) Nothing in this section shall prohibit a charter school

- 1 <u>from requesting the submission of additional records and</u>
- 2 <u>information that public schools are entitled to receive after a</u>
- 3 <u>student acceptance for admission to a charter school.</u>
- 4 (b) (1) [A] Except as provided in paragraph (2) or (2.1), a
- 5 charter school shall not discriminate in its admission policies
- 6 or practices on the basis of intellectual ability[, except as
- 7 provided in paragraph (2),] or athletic ability, measures of
- 8 achievement or aptitude, status as a person with a disability,
- 9 proficiency in the English language or any other basis that
- 10 would be illegal if used by a school district.
- 11 (2) A charter school may limit admission to a particular
- 12 grade level[,] or a targeted population group composed of at-
- 13 risk students[, or areas of concentration of the school such as
- 14 mathematics, science or the arts. A charter school may establish
- 15 reasonable criteria to evaluate prospective students which shall
- 16 be outlined in the school's charter].
- 17 (2.1) Only a charter school for students in grades nine
- 18 through twelve with a concentrated, specialized or accelerated
- 19 program of study in science, technology, engineering and
- 20 mathematics (STEM) or the performing arts, as set forth in the
- 21 school's charter, may establish reasonable criteria to evaluate
- 22 prospective students for admission purposes. The admission
- 23 <u>criteria may include a test, project or audition or a review of</u>
- 24 the prospective student's prior school grades, and shall be made
- 25 <u>available at the charter school and posted on the charter</u>
- 26 school's publicly accessible Internet website. Every child who
- 27 <u>meets the admission criteria shall be eligible for admission and</u>
- 28 included in a pool for random selection if a pool is required
- 29 under subsection (a)(1).
