## AN ACT

1 2 3	Amending Title 51 (Military Affairs) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for the Combat-to-College Program.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Title 51 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
7	Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

4	<u>§ 8801. Short title of chapter.</u>
5	This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the Combat-
6	<u>to-College Program.</u>
7	<u>§ 8802. Definitions.</u>
8	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
9	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
10	context clearly indicates otherwise:
11	"Active military service." Active service in any of the
12	armed services or forces of the United States or of this
13	Commonwealth.
14	"Community college." An institution established and operated
15	under Article XIX-A of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30,
16	No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949.
17	"Department." The Department of Military and Veterans
18	Affairs.
19	"Private education institution." An institution within this
20	Commonwealth which is legally authorized to grant degrees or
21	career and technical certifications but which is not statutorily
22	established as an instrumentality of this Commonwealth nor a
23	State-related institution or community college.
24	"State higher education institution." A State system
25	institution, a State-related institution or a community college
26	located within this Commonwealth.
27	"State-related institution." Classification of a nonprofit

28 institution which is legally authorized to grant degrees, offers

29 <u>needed</u>, specified higher education services in the public

30 interest of the Commonwealth, is statutorily established as an

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1	instrumentality of this Commonwealth and receives a direct
2	annual Commonwealth appropriation.
3	"State system institution." A member university as provided
4	for in section 2002-A of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30,
5	No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949.
6	"Student veteran." Any person who is attending or planning
7	to attend a State higher education institution or private
8	education institution and is serving in the United States Armed
9	Forces, including a reserve component or National Guard, or
10	served in the United States Armed Forces, including a reserve
11	component or National Guard, and who was discharged or released
12	from service under conditions other than dishonorable.
13	"Task force." The Statewide Combat-to-College Task Force
14	established in section 8805 (relating to Statewide Combat-to-
15	<u>College Task Force).</u>
16	<u>§ 8803. Student veterans program.</u>

Requirements. (a) RequirementsEach State higher education institution shall do the following: (1) For a campus that is not solely online, provide a

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1	administration and the coordinator under subsection (b) to
2	the extent that funds are available.
3	(2) Provide outreach, information and advocacy
4	assistance to student veterans to help ensure that they
5	receive reasonable accommodations for any disability pursuant
6	to the laws of the United States and this Commonwealth.
7	(3) Develop programs to provide academic and career
8	counseling specifically for student veterans that should
9	include, but not be limited to, peer mentoring and peer
10	support programs.
11	(4) Develop programs to provide reasonable access to
12	specialized mental health counseling services or resources
13	for student veterans.
14	(5) Develop job search assistance programs designed for
15	student veterans during student veterans' enrollment and for
16	at least two years following the student veteran's
17	graduation.
18	(6) Not charge an admissions or similar fee for student
19	veterans returning to the same education institution which
20	they attended prior to mobilization.
21	(7) Provide specific information on programs developed
22	or coordinated pursuant to this chapter, and other
23	information relevant to veterans, on the institution's
24	<u>Internet website.</u>
25	(8) Provide postsecondary credit to student veterans for
26	military training while serving in the armed forces or
27	National Guard if the American Council on Education
28	recommends that postsecondary credit should be provided for
29	military training or provide preadmission counseling to
30	provide a prospective student veteran a detailed analysis of

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1	what postsecondary credit will be accepted based on the
2	student veteran's military training.
3	(9) Provide student veterans an alternative status that
4	reflects mobilization rather than a "W" or withdrawn status
5	on student veterans' transcripts at the student veteran's
6	request in the event of a student veteran being called to
7	<u>active Federal or State duty.</u>
8	(10) Provide for community-based collaborations to allow
9	the private sector to support combat-to-college programs
10	through financial and in-kind gifts.
11	(b) Coordinator dutiesEach State higher education
12	institution shall designate a coordinator for each campus who
13	<u>shall:</u>
14	(1) Develop programs to promote a positive educational
15	environment for student veterans.
16	(2) Implement training programs for the staff relating
17	to identifying and assisting student veterans who may benefit
18	from the specialized services and resources developed or
19	coordinated pursuant to this chapter.
20	(3) Make recommendations to the institution's
21	administration and the task force concerning ways to improve
22	the education of student veterans.
23	(4) Coordinate access to stress management, counseling
24	programs and other resources available.
25	(5) Coordinate with the department to educate student
26	veterans about available Commonwealth programs.
27	(6) Coordinate with the United States Department of
28	Veterans Affairs to educate student veterans on available
29	Federal benefits, including work-study programs offered by
30	the United States Department of Veterans Affairs.

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1	(7) Coordinate activities, seminars and programs for
2	student veterans presented by veterans organizations.
3	(8) Coordinate campus activities and social events
4	designed for student veterans.
5	(9) Coordinate programs to assist student veterans in
6	locating employment and internships.
7	<u>§ 8805. Statewide Combat-to-College Task Force.</u>
8	(a) Establishment and compositionA Statewide Combat-to-
9	College Task Force shall be established, consisting of 15
10	members serving four-year terms which shall include:
11	(1) Four members appointed by the Governor, one of whom
12	shall be from a State system institution, one of whom shall
13	be from a State-related institution, one of whom shall be
14	from a community college and one of whom shall be from a
15	private education institution that provides services
16	specified in section 8804 (relating to requirements) to its
17	student veterans.
18	(2) One member appointed by the Governor who serves on
19	the State Veterans' Commission.
20	(3) The Chairman of the Pennsylvania Higher Education
21	<u>Assistance Agency or his designee.</u>
22	(4) The Secretary of Education or his designee.
23	(5) The Adjutant General or his designee.
24	(6) Three members appointed by the Governor who are
25	<u>student veteran or former student veteran representatives.</u>
26	(7) One Senator appointed for a two-year term by the
27	President pro tempore of the Senate and one Senator appointed
28	for a two-year term by the Minority Leader of the Senate, one
29	member of the House of Representatives appointed for a two-
30	year term by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and

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1	one member of the House of Representatives appointed for a
2	two-year term by the Minority Leader of the House of
3	<u>Representatives.</u>
4	(b) VacanciesAny vacancy on the task force shall be
5	filled by the original appointing officer.
6	<u>(c) Duties</u>
7	(1) Assess, refine and recommend improvements for
8	outreach services to provide veterans with necessary
9	information regarding postsecondary opportunities upon return
10	from service and develop best practices to help them graduate
11	from this Commonwealth's postsecondary education
12	institutions.
13	(2) Review and approve annual applications of State
14	higher education institutions that demonstrate compliance
15	with section 8804 in order to receive the "Combat-to-College
16	<u>Certified" title.</u>
17	(3) Review and approve annual applications from private
18	education institutions to receive a "Combat-to-College
19	Certified" title for voluntary compliance with this chapter.
20	(4) Promote partnerships with the Veterans'
21	Administration that help reduce out-of-pocket expenses to
22	<u>student veterans.</u>
23	(5) Assess gaps in student support and policy that may
24	exist at the Federal level, including the Government Issued
25	(GI) Bill and the Pell Grant Program, and recommend changes
26	in the Federal and State higher education financial
27	assistance programs to develop solutions to result in
28	unfettered access to postsecondary education opportunities.
29	(6) Provide ways to easily report accurate data on the
30	use and results of the programs authorized by this chapter.

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1	(7) Promote partnerships to provide financial resources
2	to help enable State higher education institutions and
3	private education institutions to meet the State standards
4	authorized in this chapter.
5	(8) Receive comments and testimony from student veterans
6	and others.
7	(9) Annually report to the General Assembly on the use
8	and results of the programs described in this chapter.
9	<u>§ 8806. Private education institutions.</u>
10	A private education institution shall be awarded an annual
11	"Combat-to-College Certified" status by the task force if the
12	private education institution voluntarily complies with State
13	standards for student veterans' programs as described in section
14	8804 (relating to requirements).
15	§ 8807. Department of Military and Veterans Affairs.
16	(a) Department assistanceThe department is authorized to
17	assist the task force in its duties.
18	(b) FundingThe department is authorized to apply for
19	Federal and private funding for training, outreach and other
20	expenses to help enable State higher education institutions and
21	private education institutions meet the State standards
22	authorized in this chapter.
23	(c) ReportsThe department shall publish on its Internet
24	website the reports on information collected pursuant to
25	sections 8804 (relating to requirements), 8805 (relating to
26	Statewide Combat-to-College Task Force), 8806 (relating to
27	private education institutions) and 8808 (relating to reporting
28	provisions) along with any other information it deems useful to
29	assist student veterans.
30	<u>§ 8808. Reporting provisions.</u>

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1	Starting 90 days after the effective date of this chapter,
2	every State higher education institution and private education
3	institution voluntarily certified as "Combat-to-College" shall
4	annually report to the department and to the task force on
5	whether they offer the services described in section 8804
6	(relating to requirements) and the utilization and results of
7	the services authorized by this chapter.
8	<u>§ 8809. Sunset provision.</u>
9	This chapter shall sunset 15 years from the effective date of
10	this chapter.
11	Section 2. This act shall take effect as follows:
12	(1) Sections 8803 and 8804 of Title 51 shall take effect
13	in one year.
14	(2) The remainder of this act shall take effect in 60
15	days.
