* * * 2 Section 2. Section 1207(6) of Title 4 is amended to read: 3 § 1207. Regulatory authority of board. 4 5 The board shall have the power and its duties shall be to: * * * 6 (6) Prescribe criteria and conditions for the operation 7 8 of slot machine progressive systems. A wide area progressive 9 slot system shall be collectively administered by 10 participating slot machine licensees in accordance with the terms of a written agreement executed by each participating 11 12 slot machine licensee and approved by the board. The board 13 may enter into an interstate compact or reciprocal agreement 14 with another state for the conduct and administration of a 15 multistate progressive system. The board shall promulgate regulations prescribing criteria and conditions for 16 17 interstate compacts and reciprocal agreements. * * * 18 19 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
