AN ACT

Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled, as 1 reenacted, "An act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and 2 malt and brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating 3 and changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession, 5 consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic 7 liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the 8 9 persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing 10 for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores, 11 for the payment of certain license fees to the respective 12 municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain 13 nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure 14 without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures; 15 providing for local option, and repealing existing laws," in 16 licenses and regulations and liquor, alcohol and malt and 17 brewed beverages, further providing for sales by liquor 18 19 licensees and restrictions. 20 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 21 hereby enacts as follows: 22 Section 1. Section 406(a) of the act of April 12, 1951 23 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, reenacted and amended 24 June 29, 1987 (P.L.32, No.14), is amended by adding a paragraph 25 to read:

Section 406. Sales by Liquor Licensees; Restrictions. -- (a)

- 2 (7) (i) Notwithstanding any provision of this act to the
- 3 contrary, the act by a bed and breakfast homestead or inn of
- 4 providing one bottle of a PA Preferred alcoholic product to its
- 5 paying quests at check-in while in an overnight status shall not
- 6 be construed as the direct or indirect sale of alcohol so long
- 7 <u>as that wine is produced by a licensed limited winery as</u>
- 8 provided for under section 505.2.
- 9 (ii) For purposes of this paragraph, a "bed and breakfast
- 10 homestead or inn" shall mean a private residence that contains
- 11 ten or fewer bedrooms used for providing overnight
- 12 accommodations to the public and in which breakfast is the only
- 13 meal served and is included in the charge for the room.

- 15 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
