## AN ACT

1 Designating a section of Christopher Columbus Boulevard between

8 NICHOLSON TOWNSHIP, WYOMING COUNTY, AS THE JODY ALLEN CRON  
9 MEMORIAL BRIDGE; DESIGNATING EXIT 113, STATE RAMP 8001, FROM  
10 INTERSTATE 79 ONTO STATE ROUTE 208, IN SPRINGFIELD TOWNSHIP,  
11 MERCER COUNTY, AS THE LIEUTENANT COLONEL MICHAEL E.  
12 MCLAUGHLIN VETERANS RAMP; ~~DESIGNATING THE INTERCHANGE OF~~ <--

4 ~~COUNTY, AS THE PAUL REIDER BRIDGE; AND DESIGNATING A PORTION~~  
5 ~~OF STATE ROUTE 2029 AND 2049, ALSO KNOWN AS BATH ROAD, IN~~  
6 ~~BRISTOL TOWNSHIP, BUCKS COUNTY, AS THE SERGEANT GEORGE~~  
7 ~~STUCKEY MEMORIAL ROAD; AND MAKING A RELATED REPEAL.~~

8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

9 hereby enacts as follows:

10 Section 1. William J. Guarneri and Edward "Babe" Heffron  
11 Memorial Boulevard.

12 (a) William J. Guarneri.--The General Assembly finds and  
13 declares as follows:

14 (1) Born in South Philadelphia on April 28, 1923,  
15 William J. Guarneri, also known as Wild Bill, was the son of  
16 the late Joseph and Augusta Guarneri.

17 (2) Mr. Guarneri joined the Citizens Military Training  
18 Camp and graduated from South Philadelphia High School in  
19 1941 while working for Baldwin Locomotive Works building  
20 Sherman tanks for the United States Army.

21 (3) He enlisted in the United States Army on August 31,  
22 1942, and served as a Staff Sergeant with Easy Company, 2nd  
23 Battalion, 506th Parachute Infantry Regiment, in the 101st  
24 Airborne Division during World War II.

25 (4) As a paratrooper, Mr. Guarneri made his first combat  
26 jump on D-Day as part of the Allied invasion of France, and  
27 he fought during the Battle of Normandy, Operation Market  
28 Garden and the Battle of the Bulge.

29 (5) He was awarded the Silver Star, the Bronze Star with  
30 oak leaf cluster, the Purple Heart with two oak leaf  
31 clusters, the Good Conduct Medal, the Campaign Medal with  
32 three service stars and arrow device, the World War II  
33 Victory Medal and a Presidential Unit Citation with oak leaf

1 cluster.

2 (6) Mr. Guarnera was portrayed in the miniseries, Band  
3 of Brothers, produced by Tom Hanks and Steven Spielberg in  
4 2001.

5 (7) He was a beloved family member, dedicated worker and  
6 honorable military veteran. He exemplified the best qualities  
7 of the human experience.

8 (8) William J. Guarnera passed away at the age of 90 on  
9 March 8, 2014. He generously gave his heart and time to  
10 enhance the quality of life of his family and community.

11 (b) Mr. Edward "Babe" Heffron.--The General Assembly further  
12 finds and declares as follows:

13 (1) Born in South Philadelphia on May 16, 1923, Edward  
14 James Heffron, also known as Babe, was the son of the late  
15 Joseph and Anne Heffron.

16 (2) Mr. Heffron attended Sacred Heart Catholic School  
17 and South Philadelphia High School.

18 (3) Mr. Heffron was employed with New York Shipbuilding  
19 in Camden, New Jersey, before enlisting in the United States  
20 Army on November 7, 1942.

21 (4) He served as a Private First Class with Easy  
22 Company, 2nd Battalion, 506th Parachute Infantry Regiment, in  
23 the 101st Airborne Division during World War II.

24 (5) Mr. Heffron fought in several battles, including  
25 Operation Market Garden and the Battle of the Bulge, and was  
26 involved in the liberation of the Kaufering concentration  
27 camp in Landsberg, Germany.

28 (6) For his gallant service, Mr. Heffron received the  
29 Bronze Star, Purple Heart, the Good Conduct Medal and the  
30 European-African-Middle Eastern Campaign Medal.

1 (7) He was also portrayed in the miniseries, Band of  
2 Brothers, in 2001.

3 (8) A beloved family member, dedicated worker and  
4 honorable military veteran, Mr. Heffron exemplified the best  
5 qualities of the human experience.

6 (9) Mr. Heffron passed away at the age of 90 on December  
7 1, 2013.

8 (c) Designation.--The section of Christopher Columbus  
9 Boulevard between Oregon Avenue and Washington Avenue in the  
10 City of Philadelphia, Philadelphia County, is hereby designated  
11 as the William J. Guarneri and Edward "Babe" Heffron Memorial  
12 Boulevard.

13 (d) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and  
14 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the boulevard  
15 designated in subsection (c).

16 SECTION 2. SENATOR NOAH W. WENGER HIGHWAY. <--

17 (A) DESIGNATION.--THE SECTION OF US ROUTE 222 IN LANCASTER  
18 COUNTY, FROM THE POINT AT WHICH US ROUTE 222 ENTERS WARWICK  
19 TOWNSHIP TO THE EPHRATA US 322 EXIT, IS HEREBY DESIGNATED THE  
20 SENATOR NOAH W. WENGER HIGHWAY.

21 (B) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND  
22 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE HIGHWAY TO  
23 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE HIGHWAY.

24 SECTION 3. JODY ALLEN CRON MEMORIAL BRIDGE. <--

25 (A) DESIGNATION.--THE BRIDGE LOCATED ON STATE ROUTE 1029  
26 OVER THE TUNKHANNOCK CREEK, NICHOLSON TOWNSHIP, WYOMING COUNTY,  
27 IS HEREBY DESIGNATED THE JODY ALLEN CRON MEMORIAL BRIDGE IN  
28 MEMORY OF PFC CRON'S SERVICE AND SACRIFICE DURING THE VIETNAM  
29 CONFLICT.

30 (B) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND

1 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE BRIDGE TO  
2 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE BRIDGE.

3 SECTION 4. LIEUTENANT COLONEL MICHAEL E. MCLAUGHLIN VETERANS  
4 RAMP.

5 (A) FINDINGS.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AS FOLLOWS:

6 (1) LIEUTENANT COLONEL MICHAEL E. MCLAUGHLIN SERVED THIS  
7 COUNTRY AND THIS COMMONWEALTH WITH HONOR AND DISTINCTION AS A  
8 MEMBER OF THE PENNSYLVANIA NATIONAL GUARD. HE WAS A NATIVE OF  
9 TIONESTA, FOREST COUNTY, AND WAS A PRIVATE CONTRACTOR IN  
10 MERCER WHEN HE MOBILIZED WITH THE 2ND BRIGADE COMBAT TEAM,  
11 28TH INFANTRY DIVISION, OF THE PENNSYLVANIA NATIONAL GUARD IN  
12 2005.

13 (2) ON JANUARY 5, 2006, LIEUTENANT COLONEL MCLAUGHLIN  
14 GAVE HIS LIFE IN THE LINE OF DUTY WHEN HE WAS KILLED IN  
15 ACTION IN RAMADI, IRAQ. HE WAS THE FIRST OFFICER IN THE  
16 PENNSYLVANIA NATIONAL GUARD TO BE KILLED IN ACTION SINCE  
17 WORLD WAR II.

18 (B) DESIGNATION.--EXIT 113, STATE RAMP 8001, FROM INTERSTATE  
19 79 ONTO STATE ROUTE 208, IN SPRINGFIELD TOWNSHIP, MERCER COUNTY,  
20 IS HEREBY DESIGNATED THE LIEUTENANT COLONEL MICHAEL E.  
21 MCLAUGHLIN VETERANS RAMP.

22 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND  
23 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS AT THE RAMP DISPLAYING THE NAME OF  
24 THE RAMP.

4 ~~(3) THOMAS R. MATTY ENLISTED IN THE UNITED STATES MARINE~~

6 ~~ISLAND AND ADDITIONAL TRAINING AT CAMP LEJEUNE AND AT EL~~  
7 ~~TORO, CALIFORNIA. HE ARRIVED IN VIETNAM ON NOVEMBER 9, 1967.~~

8 ~~(4) MARINE CPL. THOMAS R. MATTY MADE THE ULTIMATE~~

3 FOLLOWS:

4 (1) RICHARD W. KOWALEWSKI, JR., WAS BORN ON MARCH 31,  
5 1973, IN WAYNESBURG, PENNSYLVANIA.

6 (2) RICHARD W. KOWALEWSKI, JR., ENLISTED IN THE UNITED  
7 STATES ARMY AND COMPLETED BASIC TRAINING IN JUNE 1992.

8 (3) SPECIALIST KOWALEWSKI WAS LATER ASSIGNED TO THE 3RD  
9 BATTALION, 75TH RANGER REGIMENT.

10 (4) AS PART OF A UNITED NATIONS PEACEKEEPING OPERATION,  
11 SPECIALIST KOWALEWSKI WAS DEPLOYED TO SOMALIA IN AUGUST 1993.

12 (5) ON OCTOBER 3, 1993, SPECIALIST KOWALEWSKI, ALONG  
13 WITH 17 OTHER MEN, WAS KILLED IN THE BATTLE OF MOGADISHU.  
14 DURING THE BATTLE, A GROUP OF SOMALIS, ARMED WITH AUTOMATIC  
15 WEAPONS AND ROCKET-PROPELLED GRENADES, AMBUSHED SPECIALIST  
16 KOWALEWSKI'S CONVOY WHILE IN ROUTE TO RESCUE DOWNED PILOTS OF  
17 A BLACK HAWK HELICOPTER.

18 (6) THE ENCOUNTER HAS BEEN DESCRIBED AS ONE OF OUR  
19 COUNTRY'S MOST VIOLENT FIREFIGHTS SINCE VIETNAM. THE BATTLE  
20 WAS LATER DEPICTED IN THE FAMOUS NOVEL AND MOVIE "BLACK HAWK  
21 DOWN."

22 (7) FOR HIS HEROIC ACTIONS DURING BATTLE, SPECIALIST  
23 KOWALEWSKI WAS AWARDED THE BRONZE STAR MEDAL WITH VALOR AND  
24 THE PURPLE HEART.

25 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE BRIDGE LOCATED ON STATE ROUTE 88 IN  
26 CUMBERLAND TOWNSHIP, GREENE COUNTY, SECTION Q10, SEGMENT

9 ~~IRON BRIDGE.~~

10 ~~(7) IN 1934, THE IRON BRIDGE WAS REPLACED WITH A STEEL~~
