## AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- laws relating thereto," in school directors, providing for
- 6 county-wide board of school directors pilot program.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 10 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
- 11 section to read:
- 12 <u>Section 328. County-Wide Board of School Directors Pilot</u>
- 13 Program. -- (a) The General Assembly finds and declares as
- 14 follows:
- 15 (1) The Commonwealth's system of public education is
- 16 presently comprised of five hundred (500) independently
- 17 operating school districts.
- 18 (2) School districts are governed by locally elected school
- 19 boards, which are responsible for establishing educational

- 1 programs and local policies, maintaining school buildings and
- 2 developing and approving school district budgets, including the
- 3 imposition of a local property tax.
- 4 (3) It is important that school board members be informed in
- 5 making decisions for their school districts and be encouraged to
- 6 pursue creative solutions that both enhance educational
- 7 opportunities for their students and use taxpayer resources
- 8 <u>efficiently and effectively.</u>
- 9 <u>(4) Collaboration among school board members representing</u>
- 10 <u>neighboring school districts should increase in order to</u>
- 11 <u>leverage ideas and resources.</u>
- 12 (5) It is the intent of this section to foster increased
- 13 collaborative decision-making among school boards by creating a
- 14 pilot program that will consolidate school boards to the county-
- 15 <u>wide level.</u>
- (b) Within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this
- 17 section, the Secretary of Education shall designate a county of
- 18 the fourth class in which shall be established a county-wide
- 19 board of school directors that shall have the power and duty to
- 20 govern each school district which is located in whole or in part
- 21 within the county. In designating a county of the fourth class
- 22 under this subsection, the secretary shall consider the local
- 23 tax effort of the school districts within the county to be
- 24 designated, including whether the equalized millage rate of each
- 25 school district is greater than the Statewide average equalized
- 26 millage rate.
- 27 <u>(c) Within one (1) year of the effective date of this</u>
- 28 section, notwithstanding any other provision of law or
- 29 regulation to the contrary, all powers and duties of the board
- 30 of school directors of each school district that is located in

- 1 whole or in part within the county designated under subsection
- 2 (b) shall be vested in a county-wide board of school directors
- 3 to be established pursuant to subsection (d).
- 4 (d) (1) Subject to paragraphs (2) and (3), the county-wide
- 5 board of school directors established under this section shall
- 6 consist of two (2) members representing each school district
- 7 which is located in whole or in part within the county
- 8 <u>designated under subsection</u> (b). Each qualified voter residing
- 9 <u>in a school district to be governed by the county-wide board of</u>
- 10 school directors shall be entitled to cast votes for two (2)
- 11 <u>individuals who reside in said school district pursuant to</u>
- 12 guidelines which the Department of State, in consultation with
- 13 the board of elections for the county designated under
- 14 <u>subsection</u> (b), shall establish for this purpose within ninety
- 15 (90) days of the effective date of this section.
- 16 (2) If the election of two (2) school directors representing
- 17 each school district which is located in whole or in part within
- 18 the county designated under subsection (b) would result in the
- 19 <u>election of an even number of school directors, each qualified</u>
- 20 voter residing in a school district to be governed by the
- 21 county-wide board of school directors also shall be entitled to
- 22 cast a vote for an additional at large school director, who
- 23 shall reside within a school district to be governed by the
- 24 county-wide board of school directors, pursuant to guidelines
- 25 which the Department of State, in consultation with the board of
- 26 elections for the county designated under subsection (b), shall
- 27 <u>establish for this purpose within ninety (90) days of the</u>
- 28 effective date of this section.
- 29 (3) Where any of the school districts to be governed by the
- 30 county-wide board of school directors is located in part within

- 1 <u>a county other than the county designated under subsection (b),</u>
- 2 the boards of elections for all counties in which such school
- 3 <u>districts are located in whole or in part shall cooperate with</u>
- 4 the Department of State in the establishment of the guidelines
- 5 required under this subsection.
- 6 (e) The members of the county-wide board of school directors
- 7 <u>established under this section shall have the power and duty to</u>
- 8 cast votes with respect to the affairs of all school districts
- 9 that are governed by the county-wide board of school directors,
- 10 notwithstanding each member's school district of residence.
- 11 (f) The office of county-wide school director shall be
- 12 considered a full-time, paid position. Members of the county-
- 13 wide board of school directors shall receive compensation in the
- 14 form and amount that shall be determined by the Secretary of
- 15 Education and shall be paid jointly by the school districts
- 16 governed by the county-wide board of school directors. Each
- 17 school district shall pay for the compensation of the two (2)
- 18 school directors representing said school district as well as an
- 19 equal share of the compensation of any at large school director
- 20 elected under subsection (d) (2) and shall provide administrative
- 21 support, office space and any other assistance necessary to
- 22 carry out the duties of this section. Office space for any at
- 23 <u>large school director elected under subsection (d)(2) shall be</u>
- 24 provided by the school district in which the at large school
- 25 director resides.
- 26 (q) Individuals serving as county-wide school directors
- 27 <u>under this section shall not have the right to elect membership</u>
- 28 in the Public School Employees' Retirement System established
- 29 under 24 Pa.C.S. Pt. IV (relating to retirement for school
- 30 employees) or the Pennsylvania State Employees' Retirement

- 1 System established under 71 Pa.C.S. Pt. XXV (relating to
- 2 <u>retirement for State employees and officers), nor shall service</u>
- 3 <u>as a county-wide school director under this section be eligible</u>
- 4 for credit in the Public School Employees' Retirement System or
- 5 <u>the Pennsylvania State Employees' Retirement System.</u>
- 6 (h) This section shall expire ten (10) years after the
- 7 <u>effective date of this section. Elections to the board of school</u>
- 8 <u>directors of each individual school district governed by the</u>
- 9 county-wide board of school directors established under this
- 10 section shall occur during the calendar year immediately prior
- 11 to expiration of this section pursuant to procedures set forth
- 12 in this act and in the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320),
- 13 known as the "Pennsylvania Election Code."
- 14 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
