## AN ACT

Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in riot, disorderly conduct and related offenses, further providing for THE OFFENSE OF cruelty to animals. 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 6 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 5511(q) of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania <--7 8 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding definitions and the section is amended by adding a subsection to read: SECTION 5511 OF TITLE 18 OF THE PENNSYLVANIA 10 SECTION 1. 11 CONSOLIDATED STATUTES IS AMENDED BY ADDING A SUBSECTION TO READ: 12 § 5511. Cruelty to animals. \* \* \* 13 14 15 following shall apply: 16

Τ	<u>motor venicle owner or operator commits a summary offense if</u>
2	the motor vehicle owner or operator confines a dog or cat in
3	an unattended motor vehicle in extreme heat, endangering the
4	dog's or the cat's health and well-being.
5	(2) A person who witnesses an act under paragraph (1),
6	may contact a police officer, a volunteer or professional
7	fireman, humane officer, security guard or other first
8	responder, who may take any action to safeguard the dog or
9	cat, including, but not limited to, breaking into the motor
10	vehicle to remove the dog or cat from the unattended motor
11	vehicle after a reasonable effort to search for the owner or
12	operator of the unattended motor vehicle.
13	(3) A police officer, a volunteer or professional
14	fireman, humane officer, security guard or other first
15	responder, and the department or agency employing the
16	officer, is not liable for any damage to property resulting
17	from actions taken under this section.
18	(4) If the dog or cat is removed from the motor vehicle,
19	the person removing the dog or cat shall:
20	(i) leave a note in the motor vehicle or in a
21	conspicuous location stating the person's name and
22	contact information and information as to where the dog
23	or cat can be located; and
24	(ii) take the dog or cat to a veterinary hospital or
25	animal care clinic for treatment and health screening.
26	The dog or cat shall then be admitted to a shelter or
27	humane society if the motor vehicle owner or operator is
28	unable to be located.

30	(q) Definitions. As used in this section, the following

1	words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
2	subsection:

4	"Extreme heat." An extremely high temperature, inside or
5	outside of a motor vehicle, that could endanger an animal's
6	health or well being.

8	"Unattended motor vehicle." A motor vehicle that is out of
9	the owner's or operator's sight.

11	(H.3) LEAVING ANIMAL IN UNATTENDED VEHICLE
12	(1) A PERSON OWES A DUTY OF CARE TO ANY DOG OR CAT THAT
13	THE PERSON LEAVES CONFINED IN AN UNATTENDED VEHICLE.
14	(2) NO POLICE OFFICER, HUMANE SOCIETY POLICE OFFICER OR
15	FIREFIGHTER WHO ENTERS INTO AN UNATTENDED VEHICLE IN ORDER TO
16	RESCUE A DOG OR CAT, NOR THE EMPLOYER OF ANY SUCH PERSON,
17	SHALL BE LIABLE FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED BY THE RESCUE, PROVIDED
18	THAT THE PERSON:
19	(I) PRIOR TO ENTRY, MAKES A REASONABLE EFFORT TO
20	LOCATE THE PERSON WHO OWES A DUTY OF CARE TO THE ANIMAL.
21	(II) ACTS UNDER A REASONABLE BELIEF THAT THE ANIMAL
22	IS IN SEVERE PHYSICAL DISTRESS.
23	(III) TAKES REASONABLE STEPS TO ENSURE OR RESTORE
24	THE WELL-BEING OF THE ANIMAL.
25	(IV) LEAVES A NOTE ON OR IN THE VEHICLE STATING THE
26	NAMES OF THE PERSON AND THE PERSON'S EMPLOYER, A
27	TELEPHONE NUMBER AND THE LOCATION WHERE THE ANIMAL MAY BE
28	RETRIEVED.
29	(3) THE IMMUNITY PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) SHALL APPLY
30	RECARDIESS OF WHETHER THE PERSON IS CHARGED WITH OR FOUND

- 1 GUILTY OF COMMITTING AN OFFENSE UNDER THIS SECTION.
- 2 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
