6	Section 1. Title 44 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
7	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
8	<u>§ 7133. Ineligibility.</u>
9	(a) General ruleAn individual shall be ineligible to be a
10	constable or deputy constable if the individual:
11	(1) was convicted of an offense graded as a felony and
12	has not been pardoned; or
13	<u>(2) is required to register under 42 Pa.C.S. § 9799.13</u>
14	(relating to applicability).
15	(b) CertificationThe Constables' Education and Training
16	Board may not certify an individual as a constable or deputy
17	constable under section 7144(9) (relating to program
18	established) if the individual is disgualified under subsection

(a). The board shall check criminal history record information 1 under 18 Pa.C.S. Ch. 91 (relating to criminal history record 2 information) to verify eligibility under subsection (a). 3 Section 2. Restricted account. 5 6 * * * (b) Surcharge.--There is assessed as a cost in each case 7 8 before a magisterial district judge a surcharge of [\$5] <u>\$9</u> per docket number in each criminal case and [\$5] <u>\$9</u> per named 9 defendant in each civil case in which a constable or deputy 10

11 constable performs a service provided in Subchapter G (relating 12 to compensation), except that no county shall be required to pay 13 this surcharge on behalf of any indigent or other defendant in a 14 criminal case.
