AN ACT

Amending the act of December 19, 1996 (P.L.1478, No.190), 1 entitled "An act relating to the recycling and reuse of waste 2 tires; providing for the proper disposal of waste tires and 3 the cleanup of stockpiled tires; authorizing investment tax 4 credits for utilizing waste tires; providing remediation 5 grants for the cleanup of tire piles and for pollution 6 prevention programs for small business and households; 7 8 establishing the Small Business and Household Pollution Prevention Program and management standards for small 9 business hazardous waste; providing for a household hazardous 10 waste program and for grant programs; making appropriations; and making repeals," further providing for household 11 12 13 hazardous waste collection program.

14 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

15 hereby enacts as follows:

16 Section 1. Section 206 of the act of December 19, 1996 17 (P.L.1478, No.190), entitled, "An act relating to the recycling 18 and reuse of waste tires; providing for the proper disposal of 19 waste tires and the cleanup of stockpiled tires; authorizing 20 investment tax credits for utilizing waste tires; providing 21 remediation grants for the cleanup of tire piles and for 22 pollution prevention programs for small business and households;

1 establishing the Small Business and Household Pollution 2 Prevention Program and management standards for small business 3 hazardous waste; providing for a household hazardous waste program and for grant programs; making appropriations; and 4 making repeals," is amended by adding a subsection to read: 5 Section 206. Household hazardous waste collection program. 6 7 * * * (c) Household prescription drug and pharmaceutical waste.--8 9 (1) The exclusion in 40 CFR 261.4(b)(1) (relating to 10 exclusions) shall apply to unused, expired or unwanted prescription drugs and over-the-counter pharmaceutical 11 products generated by households if the wastes are collected 12 as part of a registered collection event, separately managed 13 14 and destroyed in a manner that renders the drugs and pharmaceutical products nonretrievable through resource 15 16 recovery facilities. 17 (2) Expired or unwanted prescription drugs and over-the-18 counter pharmaceutical products generated by households and 19 collected as part of a registered collection event may be 20 destroyed through industrial furnaces, resource recovery 21 facilities or any other facility that renders the drugs and 22 pharmaceutical products nonretrievable to prevent diversion 23 of the wastes for illicit purpose and protect this Commonwealth's waters, public health and safety. 24 25 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
