AN ACT

1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
2 Statutes, in registration of vehicles, further providing for
3 person with disability plate and placard.

4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5 hereby enacts as follows:

6 Section 1. Section 1338(c)(1) and (2) of Title 75 of the
7 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read:

8 § 1338. Person with disability plate and placard.

9 * * *

10 (c) Health care provider's statement.--

11 (1) Any person applying for a special plate or parking
12 placard for persons with disabilities must present a
13 statement, certified by a physician, podiatrist,
14 chiropractor, optometrist, physician assistant or certified
15 registered nurse practitioner licensed or certified to
16 practice in this Commonwealth or in a contiguous state, that
17 the person with a disability is disabled as provided in

1 subsection (a).

2 (2) Any person applying for a renewal of registration of
3 a special plate for persons with disabilities must comply
4 with this subsection. Once a person with a disability has
5 been duly certified by a physician, podiatrist, chiropractor,
6 optometrist, physician assistant or certified registered
7 nurse practitioner as being disabled, as provided in
8 subsection (a), the applicant need not submit a certification
9 for subsequent renewals of registration for a special plate
10 for persons with disabilities. A person who was issued a
11 person with disability plate under this section and no longer
12 qualifies for one shall not be charged a replacement fee for
13 a regular registration plate upon payment of the regular
14 registration fee.

16 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
