A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the importance of finding the cause and cure for
- 2 multiple sclerosis; expressing appreciation to the
- 3 Pennsylvania chapters of the National Multiple Sclerosis
- Society for their work; and recognizing the week of March 2
- 5 through 8, 2015, as "Multiple Sclerosis Awareness Week" in
- 6 Pennsylvania.
- 7 WHEREAS, Multiple sclerosis is a neurological disease of the
- 8 central nervous system, affecting an estimated 400,000
- 9 Americans, and nearly 200 new cases of multiple sclerosis are
- 10 diagnosed each week nationwide; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania chapters of the National Multiple
- 12 Sclerosis Society report that in this Commonwealth more than
- 13 19,000 people are affected by this devastating disease, the
- 14 fifth highest incident rate in the country; and
- WHEREAS, Multiple sclerosis generally strikes young adults 20

- 1 through 50 years of age, attacking them in the prime of their
- 2 lives, and some of these young adults diagnosed with multiple
- 3 sclerosis experience tremendous suffering and pain, leading to
- 4 total paralysis in some cases, and the cause and cure for this
- 5 debilitating disease remain unknown; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania chapters of the National Multiple
- 7 Sclerosis Society have been committed throughout the years to
- 8 heightening public knowledge and insight about this devastating
- 9 and crippling disease, and the chapters are currently planning
- 10 several major Statewide fundraisers and educational programs and
- 11 are providing direct services in order to raise awareness about
- 12 the effects of multiple sclerosis; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Finding the cause and developing a method of
- 14 prevention for multiple sclerosis is an important task that all
- 15 Pennsylvanians should support; therefore be it
- 16 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 17 importance of finding the cause and cure for multiple sclerosis,
- 18 a terribly perplexing and painful disease which affects hundreds
- 19 of thousands of Americans, including many Pennsylvanians; and be
- 20 it further
- 21 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives express its
- 22 appreciation and admiration for the major work that the National
- 23 Multiple Sclerosis Society has done over the years to heighten
- 24 the public's knowledge and insight about this debilitating
- 25 disease; and be it further
- 26 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 27 week of March 2 through 8, 2015, as "Multiple Sclerosis
- 28 Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania and encourage the citizens of
- 29 this great State to join in the fight to end this devastating
- 30 disease.
