A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of November 2015 as "Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, An estimated 39,590 people die from pancreatic
- 4 cancer annually; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Pancreatic cancer is one of the deadliest cancers
- 6 and is the fourth leading cause of cancer deaths in the United
- 7 States; and
- 8 WHEREAS, When symptoms of pancreatic cancer present
- 9 themselves, it is usually too late for an optimistic prognosis
- 10 and 74% of pancreatic cancer patients die within the first year
- 11 of their diagnoses while 94% of pancreatic cancer patients die
- 12 within five years; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Of all the racial/ethnic groups in the United

- 1 States, African Americans have the highest incidence of
- 2 pancreatic cancer, between 34% and 70% higher than the other
- 3 groups; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Approximately 2,000 deaths occur annually in
- 5 Pennsylvania as a result of the disease; and
- 6 WHEREAS, There is no cure for pancreatic cancer and there
- 7 have been no significant improvements in survival rates in the
- 8 last 40 years;
- 9 WHEREAS, The Federal Government invests significantly less
- 10 money in pancreatic cancer research than it does in any of the
- 11 other leading cancer killers; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Pancreatic cancer research constitutes approximately
- 13 2% of the National Cancer Institute's Federal research funding,
- 14 a figure far too low given the severity of the disease, its
- 15 mortality rate and how little is known about how to eradicate
- 16 it; and
- 17 WHEREAS, The Pancreatic Cancer Action Network is the first
- 18 and only national patient advocacy organization that serves the
- 19 pancreatic cancer community in Pennsylvania and nationwide by
- 20 focusing its efforts on public policy, research funding, patient
- 21 services and public awareness and education related to
- 22 developing effective treatments and a cure for pancreatic
- 23 cancer; and
- 24 WHEREAS, The Pancreatic Cancer Action Network supports
- 25 patients currently battling pancreatic cancer, as well as the
- 26 families of those who have lost their lives to the disease, and
- 27 is committed to nothing less than a cure; and
- 28 WHEREAS, The good health and well-being of the residents of
- 29 this Commonwealth are enhanced as a direct result of increased
- 30 awareness about pancreatic cancer and research in early

- 1 detection, causes and effective treatments; therefore be it
- 2 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 3 month of November 2015 as "Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Month" in
- 4 Pennsylvania.
