A RESOLUTION

1 2 3 4	Urging the Governor to reconsider the resettlement of Syrian refugees in this Commonwealth until such time as systems are in place to thoroughly conduct security and background checks on Syrian refugees.
5	WHEREAS, In order to address the migrant crisis in Syria, the
6	Federal Government has indicated that the United States will
7	accept at least 10,000 Syrian refugees during fiscal year 2016;
8	and
9	WHEREAS, The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has an abundant and
10	successful history of embracing immigrants; and
11	WHEREAS, The most important responsibility of government is
12	to protect the safety and security of the residents of the
13	Commonwealth of Pennsylvania; and
14	WHEREAS, On November 13, 2015, coordinated terror attacks
15	were carried out in Paris, France, killing at least 129 people
16	and injuring more than 350 people; and

1 WHEREAS, On November 14, 2015, the Islamic State (ISIS), a 2 deadly terrorist organization based in Raqqa, Syria, claimed 3 responsibility for the attacks and pledged further attacks 4 worldwide; and

5 WHEREAS, According to French police, a Syrian passport 6 belonging to a Syrian asylum seeker who entered Europe through 7 Greece was found near the body of one suicide bomber; and 8 WHEREAS, This raises concerns that the security vetting 9 procedures used in addressing the Syrian migrant crisis are 10 inadequate; and

11 WHEREAS, On February 11, 2015, Francis X. Taylor, Under Secretary for Intelligence and Analysis for the United States 12 13 Department of Homeland Security, stated, "We are concerned about any group of people coming to the United States who may be 14 coming to the United States for nefarious purposes"; and 15 16 WHEREAS, Under Secretary Taylor further testified that officials "want to make sure that if we are asked to vet 17 18 individuals from any part of the world to come to the United 19 States, that we have applied the most rigorous screening that's available within the U.S. government"; and 20

21 WHEREAS, On February 11, 2015, Nicholas J. Rasmussen,
22 Director of the National Counterterrorism Center, testified in
23 front of the United States House of Representatives' Committee

24 on Homeland Security that Syrian refugees are:

clearly a population of concern and, as Under Secretary Taylor said, what we want to be able to do is apply the full weight of U.S. intelligence community holdings to the vetting and screening process so that we can unearth any information that we may have in our holdings that gives us concern about particular individuals; and

Assistant Director, Counterterrorism Division, Federal Bureau of 1 2 Investigation, testified in front of the United States House of 3 Representatives' Committee on Homeland Security that: 4 You have to have information to vet, so the concern in 5 Syria is that we don't have systems in place on the ground to collect the information to vet. That would be 6 7 the concern we would be vetting--databases don't hold the 8 information on those individuals, and that is the 9 concern; 10 and 11 WHEREAS, Increased security measures are necessary following the recent terror attacks in order to protect the security, 12 safety and basic freedoms of the residents of this Commonwealth; 13 14 therefore be it 15 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge the Governor 16 to reconsider the resettlement of Syrian refugees in this 17 Commonwealth until such time as systems are in place to 18 thoroughly conduct security and background checks on Syrian refugees; and be it further 19 20 RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to 21 the Governor.
