A RESOLUTION

Designating the week of December 26, 2015, through January 1, 2016, as "Kwanzaa Week" in Pennsylvania, in recognition of the cultural significance of this holiday for African people throughout the world. 5 6 WHEREAS, Kwanzaa is an African-American holiday which celebrates family, community and culture and is observed each 7 8 year by millions throughout the African community on all seven continents; and WHEREAS, The name Kwanzaa is derived from the phrase "matunda 10 11 ya kwanza," which means "first fruits of the harvest" in Swahili, a language that is the most widely spoken African 12 13 language; and WHEREAS, Kwanzaa is a cultural holiday, not a religious 14 15 holiday, and is open to all religious faiths from December 26 to 16 January 1 each year; and WHEREAS, Kwanzaa is a profound expression of African people 17 being committed to their cultural values and heritage, an annual 18

- 1 reaffirmation of the bonds between them as a people and a
- 2 celebration of their history; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The Kwanzaa celebration, with its emphasis on
- 4 community, culture, history, values and family, speaks to
- 5 African people throughout the world; and
- 6 WHEREAS, First-fruits celebrations are recorded in African
- 7 history as early as ancient Egypt; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The Kwanzaa celebration is a time for commemorating
- 9 the past and celebrating the goodness of life, family, community
- 10 and culture, and a time for people to reaffirm the bonds between
- 11 them; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Kwanzaa is a time of special reverence for the
- 13 Creator in thanks for the blessings and bounty of the earth; and
- 14 WHEREAS, This year's theme is "Embracing Kwanzaa's Principles
- 15 and Practice: Creating and Celebrating the Good"; and
- 16 WHEREAS, It is estimated that roughly 18 million African
- 17 Americans take part in the Kwanzaa celebration; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The year 2015 marks the 49th anniversary of this
- 19 annual holiday; and
- 20 WHEREAS, This represents a time set aside for committing to
- 21 our highest ideals and an effort to bring forth the best in
- 22 African cultural practice; therefore be it
- 23 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 24 week of December 26, 2015, through January 1, 2016, as "Kwanzaa
- 25 Week" in Pennsylvania, in recognition of the cultural
- 26 significance of this holiday for African people throughout the
- 27 world.
