A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the 100th anniversary of the awarding of Old Economy Village to the Commonwealth.
- 3 WHEREAS, Old Economy Village is the historic home of a
- 4 community of German immigrants who began migrating from the
- 5 city-state of Wurttemberg beginning in 1803, due to religious
- 6 persecution; and
- 7 WHEREAS, These immigrants, who followed the preaching of
- 8 Johann Georg Rapp and dubbed themselves Harmonists, endeavored
- 9 to establish an entrepreneurial-based community in Butler
- 10 County; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Although the Harmonists originally settled and
- 12 established the towns of Harmony, Butler County, in 1804, and
- 13 New Harmony, located in the Indiana Territory, in 1814, the
- 14 Harmonists later returned to Butler County in 1824 and
- 15 established their third and final settlement, Economy; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The Harmony Society began as an agricultural-based
- 17 community but quickly industrialized, adding textile and grist

- 1 mills; and
- 2 WHEREAS, The Harmonists later turned to investing and enjoyed
- 3 a period of relative prosperity until the 1890s; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The Harmony Society officially dissolved on December
- 5 15, 1905; and
- 6 WHEREAS, A lengthy legal battle ensued after a joint
- 7 resolution passed by the General Assembly provided that the
- 8 abandoned land would be requisitioned by the Commonwealth; and
- 9 WHEREAS, On February 3, 1916, the Court of Common Pleas of
- 10 Beaver County awarded six acres of land in the town of Economy
- 11 to the Commonwealth; and
- 12 WHEREAS, In 1917, the Harmony Society Historical Association
- 13 was founded and began providing historic tours to the public;
- 14 and
- 15 WHEREAS, In 1919, the association entered into a contract
- 16 with the Pennsylvania Historical Commission; and
- 17 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission
- 18 formally opened Old Economy Village to the public on May 26,
- 19 1921, to an audience of nearly 5,000 people; and
- 20 WHEREAS, In February 1972, National Geographic featured an
- 21 educational insert that highlighted Old Economy's live-in
- 22 program for school children; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Old Economy Village has undergone several extensive
- 24 restorations through the years and has continued to be of great
- 25 historical importance and a favored tourist destination; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Old Economy Village is designated as a National
- 27 Historic Landmark and is listed on the National Register of
- 28 Historic Places; therefore be it
- 29 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 30 100th anniversary of the awarding of Old Economy Village to the

1 Commonwealth.
