A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing and honoring firefighters throughout this
- 2 Commonwealth for their bravery, dedication and heroism and
- designating May 4, 2016, as "Firefighters' Day" in 3
- Pennsylvania. 4
- 5 WHEREAS, In 1736, Benjamin Franklin founded the first
- 6 volunteer fire company, Union Fire Company, in Philadelphia,
- making Pennsylvania the birthplace of the volunteer fire service
- in North America; and 8
- 9 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania has approximately 2,400 fire companies,
- 10 which amounts to the largest number of fire departments
- 11 nationally; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania serves as a national leader in the

- 1 number of career and paid personnel providing emergency
- 2 services; and
- 3 WHEREAS, In this Commonwealth, volunteers staff 95% of all
- 4 fire companies with more than 50,000 volunteers, representing
- 5 the largest number of volunteer firefighters in the nation; and
- 6 WHEREAS, On average, 10 Pennsylvania firefighters die in the
- 7 line of duty every year; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Firefighters perform selfless tasks quietly and
- 9 often without the recognition they deserve, risking their lives
- 10 daily to protect the lives and property of the residents of this
- 11 Commonwealth; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Changes in society and in the environment have
- 13 increased the dangers these individuals face daily in the
- 14 performance of their duties as protectors of the residents and
- 15 property of this Commonwealth; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The increased threat of terrorism, illicit drug labs
- 17 and hazardous material incidents have placed firefighters in
- 18 greater danger than ever before in the history of firefighting;
- 19 and
- 20 WHEREAS, Although Pennsylvania has always depended heavily on
- 21 its firefighters, the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001,
- 22 and the heightened awareness of future threats have only
- 23 increased their important role as first responders; and
- 24 WHEREAS, The time that firefighters devote to protecting the
- 25 lives and property of the residents of this Commonwealth
- 26 represents time taken away from their family members; and
- 27 WHEREAS, May 4 annually serves as "International
- 28 Firefighters' Day," a worldwide celebration that started in 1999
- 29 in Australia when a firefighter named J.J. Edmondson, in
- 30 reaction to a tragic wildfire that claimed the lives of five

- 1 firefighters, sent an e-mail to his colleagues calling for an
- 2 international holiday to honor the sacrifices and triumphs of
- 3 firefighters everywhere; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Since that time, "International Firefighters' Day"
- 5 has grown to become a date in which the world's community can
- 6 stand together to recognize and honor sacrifices made by all
- 7 firefighters in their efforts to guarantee safety within their
- 8 communities; and
- 9 WHEREAS, "International Firefighters' Day" serves as a time
- 10 to thank current and past firefighters for their contributions
- 11 and to remember those men and women who have made the ultimate
- 12 sacrifice to save and protect lives in their neighborhoods;
- 13 therefore be it
- 14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize and
- 15 honor the bravery and sacrifice of firefighters in this
- 16 Commonwealth, extend thanks for their service and, on the
- 17 occasion of "International Firefighters' Day," designate May 4,
- 18 2016, as "Firefighters' Day" in Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 19 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge all members
- 20 of the General Assembly and elected officials and residents
- 21 across this Commonwealth to make efforts to honor and remember
- 22 firefighters in Pennsylvania for their dedication, service and
- 23 sacrifice, including the giving of their lives, in order to
- 24 protect the lives and property of the residents of this
- 25 Commonwealth; and be it further
- 26 RESOLVED, That such efforts may include wearing and
- 27 displaying blue and red ribbons pinned together, participating
- 28 in a memorial or recognition event, rising together in a public
- 29 meeting or gathering in honor of the sacrifices of firefighters
- 30 or by pausing for a minute at noon on the first Sunday in May as

1 a sign of gratitude for their service.
