A RESOLUTION

Designating June 10, 2016, as "Amusement Park Day" in Pennsylvania to honor amusement parks and family theme parks in Pennsylvania. 3 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania is home to numerous family theme parks that contain entertainment attractions, rides and other events for the enjoyment of individuals and families; and 7 WHEREAS, Among the numerous amusement parks and family theme 8 parks in this Commonwealth that are worthy of recognition are the following: Camelback Lodge and Aquatopia Indoor Waterpark, 10 11 which is the largest indoor water park on the East Coast and 12 is located in Pocono Township, Monroe County; 13 Conneaut Lake Park, in Crawford County, which was

founded in 1892 as Exposition Park as a permanent fairground

- 1 and exposition for livestock, machinery and industrial
- 2 products from western Pennsylvania and which was renamed in
- 3 1920 to reflect its nature as a summer resort amusement park;
- 4 (3) DelGrosso's Amusement Park, located in Tipton, Blair
- 5 County, which is a family-oriented amusement park purchased
- 6 by the DelGrosso family in 1946 and named "Bland's Park"
- 7 until 2000;
- 8 (4) Dorney Park and Wildwater Kingdom, located in South
- 9 Whitehall Township, Lehigh County, which traces its history
- 10 back to 1860 when Solomon Dorney built a trout hatchery and
- 11 summer resort on his estate outside Allentown;
- 12 (5) Dutch Wonderland, located in East Lampeter Township,
- 13 Lancaster County, which opened in 1963 and whose theme is
- 14 "Kingdom for Kids" because of its primary appeal to families
- 15 with small children;
- 16 (6) Great Wolf Lodge, an indoor water park resort that
- opened in 2005 in the Pocono Mountain region of this
- 18 Commonwealth in Pocono Township, Monroe County;
- 19 (7) Hersheypark, in Derry Township, Dauphin County,
- which was founded in 1906 by Milton S. Hershey as a leisure
- 21 park for the employees of the Hershey Chocolate Company,
- 22 which opened an Allan Herschell carousel often referred to as
- the "Merry-Go-Round" as its first ride in 1908 and which, as
- of 2015, operated 74 rides, including 13 roller coasters;
- 25 (8) Kalahari Resort and Convention Center, an indoor
- 26 water park with an African theme and named after the Kalahari
- 27 Desert in southern Africa, which opened in 2015 in Pocono
- 28 Township, Monroe County;
- 29 (9) Kennywood, in West Mifflin, Allegheny County, which
- first opened as a trolley park attraction at the end of the

- 1 Monongahela Street Railway in 1899;
- 2 (10) Knoebels Amusement Resort, opened in 1926, which is
- a family-owned and operated amusement park, picnic grove and
- 4 campground located in Cleveland and Franklin Townships,
- 5 Columbia County, and in Ralpho Township, Northumberland
- 6 County;
- 7 (11) Lakemont Park and The Island Waterpark, located in
- 8 Altoona, Blair County, which houses the world's oldest
- 9 surviving roller coaster and which opened in 1894 as a
- 10 trolley park and subsequently became an amusement park in
- 11 1899;
- 12 (12) Sesame Place, a children's theme park based on the
- 13 television program Sesame Street, which opened in 1980 in
- 14 Middletown Township, Bucks County;
- 15 (13) Split Rock Resort Indoor Waterpark, also known as
- the H20ooohh!! Indoor Family Water Park, which is located in
- 17 Kidder Township, Carbon County; and
- 18 (14) Waldameer Park and Water World, at the base of
- 19 Presque Isle in Millcreek Township, Erie County, which began
- as a picnic area called Hoffman's Grove and was renamed
- 21 "Waldameer" after the Erie Electric Motor Company leased the
- 22 park in 1896;
- 23 therefore be it
- 24 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate June
- 25 10, 2016, as "Amusement Park Day" in Pennsylvania to honor
- 26 amusement parks and family theme parks in Pennsylvania; and be
- 27 it further
- 28 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge individuals
- 29 and families to take the opportunity to visit the numerous
- 30 family theme parks across this Commonwealth.
