A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the month of May 2016 as "National Drug Court Month" 2 in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, "Criminal Justice Reform in Action" is the theme of
- 4 the 2016 "National Drug Court Month" observance; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The expansion of drug courts has been a key reform
- 6 in the fight against drug abuse and criminality in many
- 7 jurisdictions; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Underlying chronic behaviors are the focus of these
- 9 specialized courts; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Judges work with a community team to develop a case
- 11 plan that includes regular court appearances, treatment
- 12 sessions, monitoring of an offender's compliance and aftercare;
- 13 and
- 14 WHEREAS, Volunteer mentors may provide additional support for
- 15 court-involved individuals; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Graduated sanctions, incentives, evidence-based
- 2 treatment, education and training benefits and related services
- 3 are applied as needed; and
- 4 WHEREAS, "National Drug Court Month" highlights the
- 5 collective impact of adult drug courts, juvenile drug courts,
- 6 family dependency treatment courts, tribal healing to wellness
- 7 courts, DWI/DUI courts and veterans treatment courts; and
- 8 WHEREAS, These courts have effectively reduced drug abuse,
- 9 crime and recidivism while significantly improving treatment
- 10 outcomes and saving taxpayer money; and
- 11 WHEREAS, These courts have facilitated community partnerships
- 12 to broadly enhance criminal justice, public safety and public
- 13 health; and
- 14 WHEREAS, According to the National Institute of Justice, 84%
- 15 of drug court graduates have not been rearrested or charged with
- 16 a serious crime in the first year after their graduation; and
- 17 WHEREAS, According to the Urban Institute, drug courts
- 18 provide \$2.21 in benefits, and up to \$3.36 in benefits among
- 19 expanded programs, for every \$1 invested; and
- 20 WHEREAS, The House of Representatives applauds the commitment
- 21 and coordination among drug court defendants, judges, case
- 22 management professionals and volunteers in the pursuit of
- 23 comprehensive intervention, treatment completion, family
- 24 reunification and sustained recovery; therefore be it
- 25 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 26 month of May 2016 as "National Drug Court Month" in
- 27 Pennsylvania.
