## A RESOLUTION

Urging the Commonwealth Financing Authority to meet its obligations under the Fiscal Code and begin the process of PlanCON reimbursement.

WHEREAS, The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania owes school
districts billions of dollars for reimbursement on construction costs; and

WHEREAS, Many of these school districts have been waiting years to receive the reimbursement owed to them by the Commonwealth; and

WHEREAS, Some school districts have waited more than decade to receive reimbursement for construction projects; and

WHEREAS, The General Assembly on multiple occasions sent
Governor Tom Wolf a bipartisan plan to reimburse school
districts for $\$ 2.5$ billion in construction costs; and
WHEREAS, Upon the final occasion, the plan became part of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known as The Fiscal Code, through the act of April 25, 2016 (P.L.168, No.25); and

WHEREAS, The act of April 25, 2016 (P.L.168, No.25) required the Commonwealth Financing Authority to meet and establish a bond program to reimburse school districts; and WHEREAS, School districts are still waiting to receive their reimbursement; and

WHEREAS, School districts are currently in the process of preparing their budgets for the next school year; and WHEREAS, School districts will again be forced to plan for another school year without their promised reimbursement if the Commonwealth Financing Authority fails to meet soon; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge the Commonwealth Financing Authority to meet immediately and begin the process of reimbursing school districts.
