A RESOLUTION

| 1 2 | Recognizing the 60th anniversary of the Interstate Highway System. |
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| 3 | WHEREAS, On June 29, 1956, President Dwight D. Eisenhower |
| 4 | signed the Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1956 to establish a |
| 5 | 41,000-mile National System of Interstate and Defense Highways, |
| 6 | known as the "Interstate Highway System"; and |
| 7 | WHEREAS, What would become the Interstate Highway System |
| 8 | began with the Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1938, directed by the |
| 9 | Bureau of Public Roads (BPR), the immediate predecessor of the |
| 10 | Federal Highway Administration; and |
| 11 | WHEREAS, The BPR issued a report concluding that a toll |
| 12 | network would not be self-supporting, and instead called for a |
| 13 | 26,700-mile interregional highway network; and |
| 14 | WHEREAS, In 1941, President Franklin D. Roosevelt |
| 15 | commissioned the National Interregional Highway Committee which |

1 issued a report in 1944 in support of a system of 33,990 miles 2 plus an additional 5,000 miles of auxiliary urban routes, and 3 the report led to the Interstate Highway System we know today; 4 and

5 WHEREAS, In 1990, the National System of Interstate and 6 Defense Highways was renamed the "Dwight D. Eisenhower National 7 System of Interstate and Defense Highways" to recognize 8 President Eisenhower's role in the creation of the system; and 9 WHEREAS, The Interstate Highway System has proven vital in 10 transporting people and goods from one region of the country to 11 another speedily and safely; and

12 WHEREAS, The Interstate Highway System has facilitated trade 13 within our Pennsylvania borders as well as our national and 14 international borders; and

15 WHEREAS, The Interstate Highway System has helped create 16 unprecedented economic expansion and opportunities for millions 17 of Americans; and

18 WHEREAS, The Interstate Highway System has brought together 19 diverse communities throughout our land and kept us connected to 20 one another as well as to the larger world; and

21 WHEREAS, The Interstate Highway System has made it easier and 22 often more enjoyable to travel to long-distance destinations and 23 spend time with family members and friends who live far away; 24 and

25 WHEREAS, The Interstate Highway System remains one of our 26 country's paramount assets as well as a symbol of this country's 27 ingenuity and commitment to freedom; therefore be it 28 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the 29 60th anniversary of the Interstate Highway System; and be it 30 further

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1 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the 2 achievements of the Federal Highway Administration, the Department of Transportation and the highway construction 3 industry, including contractors, designers, engineers, laborers, 4 materials producers and equipment companies, for their 5 contributions to the construction of the Interstate Highway 6 System and the quality of life of the residents of Pennsylvania 7 and the citizens of the United States. 8
