A RESOLUTION

1 Honoring the more than 171,000 veterans who served in World War
2 II, continuing to serve during the Korean Conflict and the
3 Vietnam Conflict.

4 WHEREAS, World War II veterans served during the period of
5 December 7, 1941, when the Japanese bombed Pearl Harbor, to
6 December 31, 1946; and

7 WHEREAS, The Korean Conflict took place from June 27, 1950,
8 with President Truman ordering troops to aid South Koreans
9 during the invasion by North Korea, to January 31, 1955; and

10 WHEREAS, The Vietnam Conflict spanned from November 1, 1955,
11 to May 15, 1975, following the Fall of Saigon to the North
12 Vietnamese; and

13 WHEREAS, Currently, 38,140 veterans of all three of these
14 conflicts are still alive; and

1 WHEREAS, More than 800 veterans of these conflicts are living
2 in Pennsylvania; and

3 WHEREAS, The continued selflessness and bravery that these
4 veterans exhibited in keeping our country safe and protecting
5 our freedoms shall be fully recognized; therefore be it

6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives honor the more
7 than 171,000 veterans who served in World War II, continuing to
8 serve during the Korean Conflict and the Vietnam Conflict; and
9 be it further

10 RESOLVED, That today we rightly salute the accomplishments of
11 the veterans of these three conflicts living in this
12 Commonwealth.
