## A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the month of October 2016 as "National Breast Cancer Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania and October 21, 2016, as "National Mammography Day" in Pennsylvania.

  WHEREAS, "National Breast Cancer Awareness Month" was founded in 1985 and has since evolved into a collaboration of national
- 6 public service organizations, professional medical associations
- 7 and government agencies working together to promote breast
- 8 cancer awareness, share information on the disease and provide
- 9 greater access to services; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Since its inception more than 30 years ago, the
- 11 "National Breast Cancer Awareness Month" effort has stood at the
- 12 forefront of promoting awareness of breast cancer issues; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Much remains to be done to educate both women and
- 14 men about breast health in order for them to become empowered to
- 15 take charge of their health through practicing regular breast
- 16 self-exams to identify changes, scheduling regular doctor visits
- 17 and mammograms as recommended, adhering to prescribed treatment
- 18 and knowing the facts about recurrence; and

- 1 WHEREAS, An important part of raising awareness involves
- 2 helping people understand the importance of screening and
- 3 detecting cancer in its early stages so that treatment can
- 4 occur, increasing survival rates and healing and decreasing
- 5 suffering; and
- 6 WHEREAS, A mammogram serves as a screening test for breast
- 7 cancer that can detect such cancer early; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Screening for breast cancer for women 40 years of
- 9 age or older through mammograms helps ensure early detection of
- 10 breast cancer; and
- 11 WHEREAS, "National Mammography Day" has existed since 1993
- 12 when President Bill Clinton first proclaimed the third Friday of
- 13 October as "National Mammography Day" to encourage women,
- 14 particularly those in high-risk groups, to make a mammography
- 15 appointment during the month of October; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Raising breast cancer awareness remains an important
- 17 issue; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The American Cancer Society estimates that in the
- 19 United States during 2016, 246,660 new cases of invasive breast
- 20 cancer will be diagnosed in women, 40,450 women will die from
- 21 breast cancer, 2,600 new cases of invasive breast cancer will be
- 22 diagnosed in men and 440 men will die from breast cancer;
- 23 therefore be it
- 24 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 25 month of October 2016 as "National Breast Cancer Awareness
- 26 Month" in Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 27 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize October
- 28 21, 2016, as "National Mammography Day" in Pennsylvania; and be
- 29 it further
- 30 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge all women

- 1 and men in this Commonwealth to have discussions with their
- 2 doctors about breast cancer, particularly about the value of
- 3 getting screened for breast cancer, especially if possible signs
- 4 of breast cancer are detected; and be it further
- 5 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives encourage women
- 6 in this Commonwealth 40 years of age or older to undergo annual
- 7 mammograms and urge women 55 years of age or older to recognize
- 8 the benefit of undergoing mammograms every two years; and be it
- 9 further
- 10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge residents to
- 11 take action during the month of October and throughout the year
- 12 to help people remain informed about the incidence of breast
- 13 cancer and how residents of this Commonwealth can protect
- 14 themselves from the disease and take proper action if breast
- 15 cancer develops.
