## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5	Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in rules of the road in general, prohibiting certain calls on handheld mobile telephones; and imposing a duty on the Department of Transportation relating to a public awareness program.
6	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
7	hereby enacts as follows:
8	Section 1. Title 75 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
9	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
10	§ 3317. Prohibiting calls on handheld mobile telephones.
11	(a) General rule Except as otherwise provided in this
12	section, no person shall operate a motor vehicle on a highway or
13	trafficway in this Commonwealth while using a handheld mobile
14	telephone to engage in a call while such vehicle is in motion.
15	(b) Presumption
16	(1) An operator of a motor vehicle who holds a handheld
17	mobile telephone to or in the immediate proximity of the
18	operator's ear while the motor vehicle is in motion is
19	presumed to be engaging in a call within the meaning of this

2	(2) The presumption established by this subsection is
3	rebuttable by evidence which shows that the operator was not
4	engaged in a call.
5	(3) The provisions of this subsection shall not be
6	construed as authorizing the seizure or forfeiture of a
7	handheld mobile telephone or a mobile electronic device,
8	unless otherwise provided by law.
9	(c) Nonapplicability Subsection (a) shall not apply to:
10	(1) The use of a handheld mobile telephone for the sole
11	purpose of communicating with any of the following regarding
12	an emergency situation:
13	(i) an emergency response operator;
L 4	(ii) a hospital, physician's office or health
L5	clinic;
L 6	(iii) an ambulance company;
L7	(iv) a fire department; or
L 8	(v) a police department.
L 9	(2) Any of the following persons while in the
20	performance of their official duties and within the scope of
21	<pre>their employment:</pre>
22	(i) a law enforcement officer;
23	(ii) a firefighter or an operator of an ambulance or
24	authorized emergency vehicle; or
25	(iii) a member of the armed forces of the United
26	States while operating a military vehicle.
27	(3) The use of a handheld radio by a person with an
28	amateur radio station license issued by the Federal
29	Communications Commission.
30	(4) The use of a hands-free mobile telephone.

- 1 (d) Penalty.--
- 2 (1) A person who violates subsection (a) commits a
- 3 summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to
- 4 pay a fine of \$50 for the first violation, \$100 for a second
- 5 <u>violation and \$150 for a third or subsequent violation.</u>
- 6 (2) No person shall be convicted of a violation of
- 7 <u>subsection (a) unless the person is also convicted of another</u>
- 8 <u>violation of this title which occurred at the same time. No</u>
- 9 <u>costs as described in 42 Pa.C.S. § 1725.1 (relating to costs)</u>
- shall be imposed for summary conviction of subsection (a).
- 11 <u>Conviction of the summary offense under this section shall</u>
- 12 <u>not constitute a moving violation.</u>
- (e) Preemption of local ordinances. -- In accordance with
- 14 <u>section 6101 (relating to applicability and uniformity of</u>
- 15 title), this section supersedes and preempts all ordinances of
- 16 any municipality with regard to the use of a handheld mobile
- 17 telephone by the operator of a motor vehicle.
- 18 (f) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 19 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 20 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 21 "Engage in a call." Talking into or listening on a handheld
- 22 mobile telephone. The term does not include holding a handheld
- 23 mobile telephone to activate, deactivate or initiate a function
- 24 of such telephone.
- 25 "Hands-free accessory." An attachment, add-on, built-in
- 26 feature or addition to a mobile telephone, whether or not
- 27 permanently installed in a motor vehicle, that when used allows
- 28 the vehicle operator to maintain both hands on the steering
- 29 wheel.
- 30 "Hands-free mobile telephone." A handheld mobile telephone

- 1 that has an internal feature or function or that is equipped
- 2 with an attachment or addition, whether or not permanently part
- 3 <u>of such handheld mobile telephone, by which a user engages in a</u>
- 4 <u>call without the use of either hand, whether or not the use of</u>
- 5 either hand is necessary to activate, deactivate or initiate a
- 6 <u>function of such telephone.</u>
- 7 "Handheld mobile telephone." A mobile telephone with which a
- 8 user engages in a call using at least one hand.
- 9 "Immediate proximity." The distance that permits an operator
- 10 of a handheld mobile telephone to hear telecommunications
- 11 transmitted over such handheld mobile telephone, but does not
- 12 require physical contact with the operator's ear.
- 13 <u>"Mobile electronic device." Any handheld or other portable</u>
- 14 <u>electronic equipment capable of providing data communication</u>
- 15 between two or more persons, including a text messaging device,
- 16 <u>a paging device</u>, <u>a personal digital assistant</u>, <u>a laptop</u>
- 17 computer, equipment that is capable of playing a video game or a
- 18 digital video disk or equipment on which digital photographs are
- 19 taken or transmitted, or any combination thereof. The term does
- 20 not include any audio equipment or equipment installed in a
- 21 motor vehicle for the purpose of providing navigation, emergency
- 22 assistance to the operator of such motor vehicle or video
- 23 entertainment to the passengers in the rear seats of such motor
- 24 vehicle.
- 25 "Mobile telephone." A cellular, analog, wireless or digital
- 26 telephone capable of sending or receiving telephone
- 27 communications without an access line for service.
- 28 "Using" or "use." Holding a handheld mobile telephone to or
- 29 <u>in the immediate proximity of the user's ear.</u>
- 30 Section 2. The Department of Transportation shall develop

- 1 and implement a comprehensive public awareness program designed
- 2 to educate the citizens of this Commonwealth regarding the
- 3 provisions of 75 Pa.C.S. § 3317.
- 4 Section 3. This act shall take effect as follows:
- 5 (1) The addition of 75 Pa.C.S. § 3317 shall take effect
- 6 in six months.
- 7 (2) The remainder of this act shall take effect
- 8 immediately.
