## AN ACT

- Amending the act of January 17, 1968 (P.L.11, No.5), entitled
  "An act establishing a fixed minimum wage and overtime rates
  for employes, with certain exceptions; providing for minimum
  rates for learners and apprentices; creating a Minimum Wage
  Advisory Board and defining its powers and duties; conferring
  powers and imposing duties upon the Department of Labor and
  Industry; imposing duties on employers; and providing
  penalties," further providing for minimum wages.
- 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 10 hereby enacts as follows:
- 11 Section 1. Section 4(a) of the act of January 17, 1968
- 12 (P.L.11, No.5), known as The Minimum Wage Act of 1968, amended
- 13 July 5, 2012 (P.L.987, No.109), is amended to read:
- 14 Section 4. Minimum Wages.--Except as may otherwise be
- 15 provided under this act:
- 16 (a) Every employer shall pay to each of his or her employes
- 17 wages for all hours worked at a rate of not less than:
- 18 (1) Two dollars sixty-five cents (\$2.65) an hour upon the
- 19 effective date of this amendment.
- 20 (2) Two dollars ninety cents (\$2.90) an hour during the year
- 21 beginning January 1, 1979.

- 1 (3) Three dollars ten cents (\$3.10) an hour during the year
- 2 beginning January 1, 1980.
- 3 (4) Three dollars thirty-five cents (\$3.35) an hour after
- 4 December 31, 1980.
- 5 (5) Three dollars seventy cents (\$3.70) an hour beginning
- 6 February 1, 1989.
- 7 (6) Five dollars fifteen cents (\$5.15) an hour beginning
- 8 September 1, 1997.
- 9 (7) Six dollars twenty-five cents (\$6.25) an hour beginning
- 10 January 1, 2007.
- 11 (8) Seven dollars fifteen cents (\$7.15) an hour beginning
- 12 July 1, 2007.
- 13 (9) Beginning January 1, 2016, and each succeeding January 1
- 14 thereafter, the minimum wage shall be increased by an annual
- 15 cost-of-living adjustment calculated by applying the percentage
- 16 change in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-
- 17 <u>U) for the Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware and Maryland area,</u>
- 18 for the most recent twelve-month period for which figures have
- 19 been officially reported by the United States Department of
- 20 Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics sixty days prior to the date
- 21 the adjustment is due to take effect, to the then current salary
- 22 amounts. The percentage increase and the minimum wage amounts
- 23 shall be determined by the secretary as herein prescribed and
- 24 public notice given in the Pennsylvania Bulletin within ten days
- 25 of the date such determination is made.

- 27 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
