AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- Statutes, further providing for special motorcycle plates for
- 3 veterans.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 1361 of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 8 § 1361. Special motorcycle plates [for] related to veterans.
- 9 <u>(a) Honorably discharged veterans.--</u>Upon application of any
- 10 person who is an honorably discharged veteran of the armed
- 11 forces of the United States, or a reserve component of the armed
- 12 forces as defined in 51 Pa.C.S. § 7301 (relating to
- 13 definitions), accompanied by a fee of \$20 which shall be in
- 14 addition to the annual registration fee and by such
- 15 documentation as the department shall require, the department
- 16 shall issue to the person a special registration plate
- 17 designating the vehicle as belonging to a person who is a

- 1 veteran. The special registration plate may be used only on a
- 2 motorcycle.
- 3 (b) Honoring our veterans. -- Upon application of any person,
- 4 accompanied by a fee of \$35 which shall be in addition to the
- 5 <u>annual registration fee and by such documentation as the</u>
- 6 <u>department shall require</u>, the <u>department shall issue to the</u>
- 7 person a special registration plate designating the motorcycle
- 8 <u>as belonging to a person who is honoring veterans of the armed</u>
- 9 forces of the United States. The special registration plate may
- 10 be used only on a motorcycle. The Veterans' Trust Fund shall
- 11 receive \$15 of the fee paid by the applicant for the plate.
- 12 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
